

## Message from Father Alexander

#### The Forgotten Fast



As we enter November and the smell of pumpkin spice, football, and warm food engulfs us, we cannot help but look towards Christmas. Our Church even does the same! Beginning November 15 we start a 40 day fast to prepare for Christmas. Wait......you say, we have to fast to prepare for Christmas? Yes! One of the more forgotten fasts of our faith, we do indeed fast from November 15-December 12 with fish being allowed and from December 12-Christmas with a strict fast (no meat, dairy, fish, wine, or oil).

Before you turn the page and we begin our litany of excuses as to why this is not feasible, let's stop, breathe, and think about how it *could* be feasible in your life. Seek advice from Fr. Apostolos, your spiritual father, or if you're really scraping around for advice, you can ask me about how to begin to implement this vital aspect of our faith into your life. If you're a Young Adult, newly-wed, just

started a family, or a more seasoned member of our parish, I cannot encourage you enough to try it. An Orthodox Christian who has no regard for the fasts is one in name only, the only question is how we can execute it in our lives with the help of a spiritual father (not making up our own rules!).

We've spoken before of why we fast in general: for self-control (if you can't stop from eating that steak, how can you stop yourself from gossiping?), for preparation of something important (if I'm full of food I often don't think about much else except myself, think Thanksgiving post-Turkey time), and finally because Christ Himself did command it ("...and WHEN you fast..."). So we should fast, this is unquestionable.

But why now? Why before Christmas, isn't it a joyful thing?! Yes, and this is why we should fast. When we pig out on all the delicious food before Christmas, we begin to slip into this idea that that's the purpose of Christmas. The gatherings, the food, the joy are byproducts only of the Birth of Jesus Christ, God Incarnate into the world. Our God became flesh and took on all the things we suffer from, including hunger, to save us. We should be able to abstain from meat for a month in remembrance of the love our God has for us.

We know that in every other aspect of our life improvement takes effort, takes going out of our comfort zone to see results and often we're very pleased with them! Let's try that this year in our fast for Christmas? Never fasted before? Try to a little and ask us how! You will see results in your spiritual life if you also pray and join in on the feast with the Church. Try it, come and see the power that your faith offers you in its medicine to heal your soul and body and truly celebrate Christmas as it is meant to be celebrated!

#### **Endowment Fund**

#### + THE HOLY TRINITY CATHEDRAL ENDOWMENT FUND +

The Holy Trinity Endowment Fund was established in 1992 with an initial deposit of \$2,000. The goal was to build the Endowment Fund whereby the interest and appreciation would one day provide sufficient income so Holy Trinity would no longer be totally dependent on an annual Festival to supplement stewardship income.

The Endowment Fund is obligated to preserve the donor's contributions such that the principal will remain inviolate and be held in perpetuity by the Church. The funds are prudently managed by the investment committee, which reports to the Parish Council. The investment committee only approves withdrawals from the earnings and appreciation, over and above the donor's contributions, and are used only to benefit Holy Trinity and its ministries.

Over the course of the past twenty-nine years the committee has held steadfast to this mission, and as a result, generous donors from our Church, desiring to leave a legacy in perpetuity for their family, have made contributions totaling \$593,140.



#### PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Information We All Need To Know

Each and every baptized Orthodox Christian must make some effort of active commitment to his or her Church. Some serve by participating in the Choir, teaching Sunday school, joining the Philoptochos Society, and volunteering in other capacities, while others assist the Church by serving as members of the Parish Council.

Being a member of the Parish Council is ministry and all those who serve are called to represent Christ and the Orthodox Faith to those they encounter in all aspects of life. This ministry work is a truly responsible task that must be served by an individual committed to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The role of a Parish Council member is a holy and spiritual one. In assisting in the administrative responsibilities of the Church, a Parish Council member acknowledges the importance of strengthening the earthly ministry of Christ through God's Church. Membership on Parish Council should not be for social reasons nor status in the Community but rather as an act of humility and conviction to Christ our Lord.

In accordance with the 2019 Regulations of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, all candidates seeking election to serve on the Parish Council must attend a **PARISH COUNCIL SEMINAR** organized by the local Parish Council and under the leadership of the Parish Priest. The purpose of the Seminar is to prepare candidates for the Parish Council as well as to increase awareness of the sacred responsibilities expected of a Council member.

#### SEMINAR ANNOUNCEMENT

HOLY TRINITY GREEK ORTHODOX CATHEDRAL will hold a PARISH COUNCIL SEMINAR on Saturday, November 20, 2021 at 4:00 P.M. in the Cathedral before the Vespers service at 5:00 P.M. and again on Sunday, November 21, 2021 after the Divine Liturgy in the Cathedral. All potential Parish Council members, including those seeking re-election, must attend at least one of these Seminar dates. In order to be placed on the ballot, one must complete the Application for candidacy form and return it to the Cathedral Office by no later than Monday, November 15, 2021 at 3:00 P.M. If an Application has not been turned in by the designated date and time, the person will be ineligible as a candidate.

## St. Nectarios Books & Beyond

Holy Apostle Philip
Commemorated November 14



The Holy and All-praised Apostle Philip, was a native of the city of Bethsaida in Galilee. He had a profound depth of knowledge of the Holy Scripture, and rightly discerning the meaning of the Old Testament prophecies, he awaited the coming of the Messiah. Through the call of the Savior (John 1:43), Philip followed Him.

After the Ascension of the Lord, the Apostle Philip preached the Word of God in Galilee, accompanying his preaching with miracles. Thus, he restored to life a dead infant in the arms of its mother. From Galilee he went to Greece, and preached among the Jews that had settled there. Some of them reported the preaching of the Apostle to Jerusalem. In response, some scribes arrived in Greece from Jerusalem, with one of the Jewish chief priests at their head, to interrogate the Apostle Philip.

The Apostle Philip exposed the lie of the chief priest, who said that the disciples of Christ had stolen away and hidden the body of Christ. Philip told instead how the Pharisees had bribed the soldiers on watch, to deliberately spread this rumor. When the Jewish chief priest and his companions began to insult the Lord and lunged at the Apostle Philip, they suddenly were struck blind. By his prayer the Apostle restored everyone's sight. Seeing this miracle, many believed in Christ.

When the Apostle Philip arrived in the city of Phrygian Hieropolis, he saw that there were many pagan temples. There was also a pagan temple where people worshiped an enormous serpent as a god. The Apostle Philip by the power of prayer killed the serpent and healed many bitten by snakes.

Among those healed was the wife of the city prefect, Amphipatos. Having learned that his wife had accepted Christianity, the prefect Amphipatos gave orders to arrest Saint Philip, his sister, and the Apostle Bartholomew traveling with them. At the urging of the pagan priests of the temple of the serpent, Amphipatos ordered the holy Apostles Philip and Bartholomew to be crucified.

Suddenly, an earthquake struck, and it knocked down all those present at the place of judgment. Hanging upon the cross by the pagan temple of the serpent, the Apostle Philip prayed for those who had crucified him, asking God to save them from the ravages of the earthquake. Seeing this happen, the people believed in Christ and began to demand that the apostles be taken down from the crosses. The Apostle Bartholomew was still alive when he was taken down, and he baptized all those believing and established a bishop for them.

But the Apostle Philip, through whose prayers everyone remained alive, except for Amphipatos and the pagan priests, died on the cross.






# Parish-wide Catechism From Darkness to Light





It's Autumn - φθινόπωρο

Greek School is in full swing. Our Greek School children are busy learning their alphabet, songs, words, phrases and even conjugating verbs.

Greece has two national holidays which are linked with major historical events and celebrated all over the country: March 25 and October 28.

The October 28th celebration is also called the "Oxi day" (oxi meaning 'no'), reminding that in 1940 prime minister Ioannis Metaxas refused the Italian forces to enter Greece. As a result, Greece entered World War II and the Greek-Italian war of 1940-1941 began.

What happened in Greece on October 28, 1940?

At dawn of October 28, 1940, the Italian ambassador, Emanuele Grazzi, presented the Greek Prime Minister Ioannis Metaxas the ultimatum of Italian Dictator Benito Mussolini. This required the Italian army to cross the border with Albania and to occupy Greece. Metaxas replied in French "Alors, c'est la guerre" ['So this is war']. In a few hours the Italian army entered northeastern Greece. Greek soldiers successfully fought the Italian-Albanian forces and pushed them back into Albania. Because of that, Hitler's German army had to step in and it invaded Greece in April 1941. The occupation lasted until October 1944.

How do Greeks celebrate their national anniversary?

Some weeks prior to October 28th Greeks start decorating streets and balconies with Greek flags. Greek TV broadcasts movies about the war of 1940. On the state radio you will hear heroic songs of the time.

In Greek School, the children learn about the importance of the war, students recite poems, sing songs and play scenes from the Greek-Italian war. The school teachers talk about Greeks' heroism at the war and the students and teacher had lentil soup.


