### Message from Father Apostolos

#### **Emerging Ministries**



Summer is a great time to catch up on one's reading list! And the most impactful book I've read this summer is titled "Canoeing the Mountains" by Tod Bolsinger who uses the term "Adventuring" to describe Adaptive Leadership. Adventuring entails trying new things and valiantly assessing one's opportunities and challenges in a reality-based and hopeful way.

One of Bolsinger's statements about Adventuring hit home; "You'll know you are on the right path when you pile up a string of failures behind you." Seems an odd thing to say, doesn't it? But his point is solid! Adaptive leadership requires courage and a willingness to chart a course "off the map," that is, away from the tried and tired methods and activities of bygone eras.

In the spirit of this Adventuring model, Holy Trinity is launching two "new" parish ministries; a Home-based Small Group Ministry, and a Parish Leadership Development Ministry. I place "new" in parentheses since neither are truly new so much as neglected in recent years.

Home-based Small Groups are very familiar to me since my parents were small group leaders in the church of my childhood. These Friday night casual get-togethers were a fantastic way to build strong friendships in our family's church which sat over 1,000 people and conducted two Sunday morning services.

Small groups allow those new to a parish to connect with others beyond the few moments available on a Sunday. Our Holy Trinity Catechism Ministry will introduce seekers to the Orthodox Faith, but only you can embrace them into the parish family. Small groups are very effective in reaching out to longabsent parish members and reconnecting with old friends.

The aim of Home-based Small Groups is primarily relationship building. Yes, training will be provided for those interested in hosting a group. A simple blueprint is available from our sister Cathedral in San Francisco which has a thriving small group ministry. Of course, we'll talk about Jesus in our groups because that's what we do! We already have four Cathedral families eager to begin hosting small groups and I invite you to become a host family as well!

The Parish Leadership Development Ministry is already underway with many of us reading the "Canoeing the Mountains" book. But I know that many others will love to join us as we discuss this Adaptive Leadership model based on Adventuring and navigating the uncharted path ahead of us in our "post-Christendom world."

Our aim is to enjoy casual, home-based reflections in the weeks ahead and to ask God for discernment as we embrace the opportunity to adventure together. But beyond this initial foray, other Parish Leadership Training modules will emerge. Our Archdiocese Youth and Young Adult Ministry has produced an incredible program called "Effective Christian Ministry."

This mentor-based ministry is designed to educate and to

equip parish youth and young adult ministers (which is everyone who interacts with parish youth in any capacity!) for the essential work of cultivating lively faith in Jesus Christ in the souls and hearts of our parish children.

Think of the Parish Leadership Development Ministry as equal parts reading group, think-tank, and action team! The work of the Gospel must be accomplished and the landscape beneath our feet has been dramatically and rapidly altered. But rather than decry this irreducible fact as a grave tragedy, we can—with the grace and strength of God—embrace the challenge in confidence! I would love you to join us, particularly you young adults!

These are but two emerging parish ministries at Holy Trinity. There will be others! And if the Lord has placed on your hearts a vitally needed ministry we are lacking, whether new and untried or simply neglected and forgotten, I'd love to hear from you and how learn how you can help!

## Why Statement

Why does Holy Trinity Cathedral exist? And why would anyone want to join our church? The most critical question any person, parish or ministry must answer is, why are you here?

As you may recall, our Parish Council went through a strategic planning exercise for our Cathedral and shared that plan with the parish at last fall's Parish Assembly. The primary focus of the plan encompasses four pillars; Community, Youth, Culture and Campus all of which support the foundation which is, our Faith.

While participating in these Metropolis stewardship seminars we realized the importance of creating a "why statement" for Holy Trinity. This "why statement" essentially sharpens our strategic plan to a fine point. One that we can clearly express in a single sentence. As a result we are proud to introduce you to Holy Trinity Cathedral's "why statement," "To be a welcoming community sharing Christ's love through faith and service."

Our hope is that this statement will inspire our parishioners to be more welcoming, more engaged in the divine services, more active in our ministries, more curious about our faith, more service-oriented to others and called to true stewardship and engaged discipleship.

We also hope that when a newcomer or visitor reads this statement on our bulletin or on our website that it calls them to want to be a part of our church family.

We pray this statement will inspire us to continue lifting Holy Trinity Cathedral to reach its greatest potential and that we all find personal inspiration to grow in our faith and become closer to our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. 





## St. Nectarios Books & Beyond



In the month of August, we celebrate the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos.



## The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ

Commemorated on August 6



Jesus took the Apostles Peter, James, and John with Him up upon a mountain, and while they were on the mountain Jesus was transfigured. His face shone like the sun, and His garments became glistening white. Moses and Elijah appeared with Christ, talking to Him. Peter declared how good it was for them to be there and expressed the desire to build three booths for Moses, Elijah, and Christ. This reference to the booths could imply that this occurred during the time of the Feast of Tabernacles when the Jews would be camping out in the fields for the grape harvest; for this Feast had acquired other associations in the course of its history, including the memory of the wanderings in the wilderness

recorded in the Old Testament book of Exodus.

While Peter was speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them. A voice came from the cloud saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him." When the disciples heard this they fell on their faces filled with awe. Jesus came to them and told them to not be afraid. When the three looked up they saw only Jesus.

As Jesus and His disciples came down the mountain, He told them not to speak of what they had seen until He had risen from the dead.

#### Dormition of the Theotokos

Commemorated on August 15


The Feast of the Dormition of Our Most Holy Lady, the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary is celebrated on August 15 each year. The Feast commemorates the repose (dormition and in the Greek kimisis) or "falling-asleep" of the Mother of Jesus Christ, our Lord. The Feast also commemorates the translation or assumption into heaven of the body of the Theotokos.

At the time of her death, the disciples of our Lord who were preaching throughout the world returned to Jerusalem to see the Theotokos. Except for the Apostle Thomas, all of them including the Apostle Paul were gathered together at her bedside. At the moment of her death, Jesus Christ himself descended and carried her soul into heaven.


Following her repose, the body of the Theotokos was taken in procession and laid in a tomb near the Garden of Gethsemane. When the Apostle Thomas arrived three days after her repose and desired to see her body, the tomb was found to be empty. The bodily assumption of the Theotokos was confirmed by the message of an angel and by her appearance to the Apostles.

This great Feast of the Church and the icon celebrates a fundamental teaching of our faith—the Resurrection of the body. In the case of the Theotokos, this has been accomplished by the divine will of God. Thus, this Feast is a feast of hope, hope in Resurrection and life eternal. Like those who gathered around the body



of the Virgin Mary, we gather around our departed loved ones and commend their souls into the hands of Christ. As we remember those who have reposed in the faith before us and have passed on into the communion of the Saints, we prepare ourselves to one day be received into the new life of the age to come.

We also affirm through this Feast as we journey toward our heavenly abode that the Mother of God intercedes for us. Through Christ she has become the mother of all of the children of God, embracing us with divine love.








## Parish-wide Catechism From Darkness to Light

How did one become a Christian in the Early Church? How did Church Fathers such as St. John Chrysostom, St. Cyril of Alexandria, and St. Ambrose of Milan teach the Orthodox Faith to new converts? What did the process of embracing Jesus Christ entail in the Apostolic Age and what were new converts expected to learn?

Anne Field has compiled these early Christian texts from the Holy Fathers into a single volume we will begin examining in September in our Parishwide Catechism Ministry. ## Bible Study: Paul's Pastoral Letters to Timothy and Titus

When we list off the books of the New Testament we tend to fall off after we finish all the names of the cities that Paul wrote to:
Corinthians, Thessalonians, Colossians, etc. but we do ourselves a great disservice to stop here. In the 3 "Pastoral Epistles" of Paul written to his disciples Timothy and Titus, we read unique and




powerful letters about the Church, doctrine, and praxis. Paul's letters to two of his disciples who he loved so deeply grant us a different approach to understanding our faith than his other letters.

We at Holy Trinity Greek School deeply believe in the importance of learning and preserving the Greek Language and Culture. The students attending Greek School for eight months (September-May) learn, write, and read with special attention to Greek Culture. Throughout the year the students are exposed to Greek Culture in many ways: they discuss religious holidays and customs, learn history, cooking regional traditional dishes, mythology, and arts. Our school presents three cultural programs during the year, one in December to celebrate the Holidays, one in March to honor the Greek Independence Day, and the last by the end of May during graduation. All programs are greatly enjoyed by our students and give them the opportunity to show off their abilities in cooking, poetry, music, and dancing, for all family and friends. If you are not familiar with our Greek School here is a brief outline of our program:

PK/K: The students learn the sound system and basic vocabulary in a fun and a happy environment. Children as young as four years old can start Greek School.

Level 1: This Level makes the transition from a purely speaking class to the reading and writing format. The students learn the Greek Alphabet, reading, writing, vocabulary and phrases leading to conversation.

Level 2: The students are able to read sentences, write and spell and use basic conversation. Grammar is introduced.

Level 3: Longer texts are introduced. The students study vocabulary, spelling and conversation. Grammar is taught in detail. Geography, history, mythology is a very important part in all levels
