# Message from Father Alexander

### Behold Through the Cross Joy Has Come to the Whole World



The month of September is an important one for our lives: school has been off and running for a month, the NFL begins and here at Holy Trinity preparation for our Festival is at ramping up and September 1 marks the beginning of the Ecclesiastical Year! In the midst of all that we celebrate the Elevation of the Holy Cross on September 14. This is an important day for us as Orthodox Christians as we remember the power and importance of the Cross in our life. We celebrate this feast 40 days after the Transfiguration of our Lord on Mount Tabor where Christ showed Himself in all His Divine Power and showing what we as humans can achieve through Him while also cautioning the disciples that He will be crucified and one the third day arise. So 40 days later we remember not His crucifixion but the power His Cross has given us. What does the Cross mean for us? The Cross means death — our death. as St. Paul wrote (and we read in the baptism service): "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?" All of us who have been baptized have united ourselves

with Christ and His Cross, and must imitate Him and die on our Cross for the eternal death of the world to have no effect on us.

The Gospel of the World is one that imitates that of Christ, but falsely: Come and live and be full of life by uniting yourself to your inner desire. Make what you feel and desire your identity.

The Gospel of Christ is the Truth however: Come and live and be full of life by uniting yourself to the One Who Is, that deep inner desire for God and for eternal life can only be accomplished in Him. But this message of salvation involves dying to the other desires, just as the false message of the World involves *dying to God*.

Hieromonk Gregory, the abbot of the Monastery of the Holy Cross in West Virginia beautifully states: "Here the Devil has won his ultimate victory: mankind no longer believes that his true self, his fundamental identity, is the image of God within him, but rather identifies his true self merely with his appetitive faculty [what we desire] — and moreover, his appetitive faculty as it exists in his present fallen condition... To put it more starkly: mankind has now been deceived into believing that his passions are his very self. On such a view, salvation is not merely extraordinarily difficult, but even intrinsically oppressive. The Christian vision of life has been diabolically transformed from the voluntary laying down of one's own life out of love (thus leading mystically to our resurrection, in union with Christ), into a bigoted and narrow-minded worldview which desires nothing other than the enslavement of all humanity by a petty and tyrannical God...but no merely earthly paradise can ever satisfy our hearts. Only through obedience can we find freedom. Only through death can we find life. Only through the Cross can we find resurrection. And only through asceticism can we ever find that which we all truly [are created to] desire: deification, theosis, union with God Himself through Christ Jesus our Lord"

It is only through the Church, through Christ, through His Cross, that we find Life. Only through dying, not to God, but to the desires we have for money, sex, drugs, food, alcohol, anger, hate, politics and crucifying these more base desires can we find LIFE. He has given us the Cross not to punish, but to free, to grant true life for eternity in Him. Through the Cross Joy and Life has come to the world.

### STEWARDSHIP - YOUR VOICE AND YOUR PARTICIPATION MATTERS

We hear the term "steward in good standing" but what does that actually mean? Well, in order to be considered a "steward in good standing" each parishioner must do two things:

- 1. Fill out a new pledge card every year.
  - AND
- 2. Make a payment towards that pledge.

Many people think that even though they haven't filled out a yearly Pledge Card, that because they continue to make payments they are a steward in good standing. Whereas others believe that if they've filled out a new card but haven't yet made a payment, they are in good standing. But both actions must be fulfilled every year in order to be a "steward in good standing."

And why is it important to be a "steward in good standing?" In order to participate and vote in parish assembly meetings, parishioners must be stewards in good standing. *The fall parish assembly is coming up on Sunday, September 25th.* There are items on the agenda that will require us to have a quorum and parish approval. Your voice and your participation is important in order to do what is best for our Cathedral and to ensure the parishioners' voices are heard.

If your name appears on the House of Stewards list below, you are a "steward in good standing." If your name is not listed please fill out a 2022 pledge card and make a payment toward that pledge in order to participate in the meeting.

There will be an opportunity to complete this process on *Sunday, September 11th during Coffee Hour. We will host a table where parishioners can fill out a 2022 card and make a contribution.*Or, simply visit the church website and fill out your card online at: www.holytrinityphx.org. Click on "Stewardship" in the upper right hand corner and fill out your pledge card. You can also sign up for WeShare our automated, online payment portal system.



There is more to becoming a "steward in good standing" than just participating in the parish assemblies. Parishioners must be in good standing in order to get married, baptize their children, become a Godparent, run for parish council or be on the board of any of our ministries.

But most importantly, it ensures that we are doing what we are called to do which is to take care of our beloved Cathedral. This is God's house that He has entrusted to us and it is our responsibility to do our part to make sure our Cathedral is strong, secure and in the best working order with engaged parishioners.

# **Endowment Fund**

### THE HOLY TRINITY CATHEDRAL ENDOWMENT FUND



The Holy Trinity Endowment Fund was established in 1992 with an initial deposit of \$2,000. The goal was to build the Endowment Fund whereby the interest and appreciation would one day provide sufficient income so Holy Trinity would no longer be totally dependent on an annual festival to supplement stewardship income.

The Endowment Fund is obligated to preserve the donor's contributions such that the principal will remain inviolate and be held in perpetuity by the Church. # Sunday School Is Now '4F'

### **New Mode of Religious Education!**

Dear Parents and Students of Holy Trinity Cathedral,

As the School Year is somehow already upon us, we are so excited to begin our new year of Youth Ministry here at Holy Trinity with some invigorating new opportunities for all ages.



For a great confluence of reasons we are changing up our usual model of Sunday School. It is no secret that our numbers in Sunday School have dwindled more and more in the last decade. This is not something we have done wrong but a universal fact in almost all parishes across the country, Orthodox and non-Orthodox. There is a lack of student attendance, parent commitment, and volunteers to even make the most simple class function. We had wonderful teachers last year, new curriculum, used only our Education Building Classrooms and yet still many went through weeks at a time of having no more than 2-3 students. We do not have the manpower to execute Sunday School in it's traditional form this year week in and week out. Knowing this, we aren't throwing in the towel and quitting but we *must* try something different to find what works so we can instruct our children in their faith and guide them to salvation.

After speaking to a few different parishes with their alternatives to Sunday School we've moved that the main event for the spiritual education of our youth at the church will now take place on the **3rd Saturday of every month (you can give your feedback on the time below)**. On these Saturdays we will have three 45 minute sessions that will give about the same amount of education time as the old model of Sunday School. Because of this shift, your child's attendance at each meeting is *critical*, please make every effort to make these the priority of your day.

To add to this, we will also be catechized as an entire parish at the end of every Sunday Divine Liturgy before the Dismissal. Fr. Apostolos and Fr. Alexander will continue to offer the homily in it's proper place after the Gospel (but a bit shortened) and whichever priest is not preaching (and sometimes a guest speaker) will offer to the community a 5-10 minute lesson at the conclusion of Divine Liturgy for all to benefit from. This lesson time will allow us to methodically work through The Nicene Creed, the center of our faith, as a whole community. The bulletin will include discussion points

We will also be including a handout "Church in the Home" to foster discussion about that Sunday's Gospel reading and how we can apply it in our lives.


Next week we will follow this with another email discussing the vast array of other ministries that will be offered here at Holy Trinity to supplement your family's growth in Christ and His Church.

We are sad to announce the passing of **Robert J. Andrews** who designed and installed the **six mosaic icons that are in front of the altar**. He was 97 years old. He was designated a Greek Orthodox iconographer by Archbishop Iakovos of North and South America.

He installed icons in 38 churches over his 56-year career as an iconographer specializing in 11th and 12<sup>th</sup> Century mosaics. He completely covered the Transfiguration Church in Lowell MA and installed the dome in Holy Trinity San Francisco. It is the largest face of Christ in the world.

He was a person of extreme talents and dedication; a family man and an art teacher. We partnered with him on developing his Artist's File which has been accepted in five museum libraries.

I used to find it extremely difficult to explain what Orthodox Christianity is about to coworkers or friends who were curious about it. Maybe because I didn't really understand what it was really about. I used to think "how do I explain what my religion is about?" Over time I realized, especially from this podcast, that instead of thinking of it as just an institution or physical place that I pray and worship, that my faith and my entire my life is centered on a person, Jesus, and Him crucified. If this is so then I should definitely understand what the Cross means, what it tells me about God, about myself, and even about human life. The Cross tells us many things, in fact, it tells us everything, and Father Thomas Hopko does an incredible job of taking something very complicated and making it very understandable. There was nothing that I disliked about this lecture series. Many quotes and themes stood out to me but if I were to choose one it would be that we are made in the image and likeness of God, who is love, to be and to do what God does, to love one another as He loves us. How do we love as He loves us? Only one way: the Cross. I guess one other thing that really stood out to me is Father Thomas Hopko saying that we are insane if we do not know in our gut that we are loved by God and that there is nothing we can do to stop the love of God for us.



In this event, another step is made in sacred history in preparation for the entrance of Christ into the world.


The icon and the feast also acknowledge a transition from barrenness to life. This was but another foreshadowing of what would be offered through Christ, the transformation from death to eternal life.

### Maintenance Corner

The Maintenance Committee has been very busy with maintenance projects and preparing for our upcoming festival. We are still working on the lighting issues outside the Chapel and Cathedral. Electrical upgrades are in process around the auxiliary kitchen & patio area in preparation for Festival equipment.

The auxiliary kitchen garage doors are being repaired to function properly. Replacement and rewiring to LED lighting in the kitchen lighting fixtures to brighten the kitchen. A brand new grease trap was installed in the kitchen and has greater capacity. The ovens have been calibrated and the grease vents have been cleaned. The freezer had an issue and was losing temp, and has been repaired. The drains in the washroom and community center have been snaked relieving the backup that was caused by blockage. New wheel casters have been installed on kitchen work tables and speed racks. We have focused on watering to green up the property in preparation for the festival. The roof drains in the Community Center have been unclogged and are now working perfectly. The grills and flat tops used for the Festival have been cleaned. The south east door sill in the Community Center has been repaired allowing the doors to work properly. The auxiliary kitchen is in process of being cleaned out and reorganized in preparation for the Festival. We will be cleaning the walls and ceilings around the patio.
