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

Message from Father Apostolos

Dying Before We Die



In the Athonite monastic tradition, there is a short phrase which is frequently seen upon entering monastic grounds which reads *"Αν πεθάνεις πριν πεθάνεις, Δέν θά πεθάνεις όταν πεθάνεις"* or in English, *"If you die before you die, you won't die when you die."* This seems a puzzle wrapped in a mystery, hidden in an enigma.

Consideration of death and mortality is certainly not encouraged in our culture and we go to tremendous lengths to avoid the topic entirely. And yet, we will soon enter Great and Holy Week on Palm Sunday evening to contemplate the "Life-giving Passion and Death of Jesus Christ." The many readings from Holy Scripture, the hymnology, and the iconographic imagery will all underscore the grim reality of Jesus' torment and execution on a Roman cross.

Experiments, of a sort, have been attempted to gauge the traumatic nature of crucifixion, only - obviously - without the nails. Volunteer subjects, once tied firmly to the cross, are scarcely erected into place before begging to be taken down, so excruciating is the position. And on Holy Thursday evening the faithful will assemble in the darkened Church to witness the specter of Christ crucified voluntarily to fulfill the Divine Will of the Father to ransom fallen and broken humanity.

In this moment, time seems suspended, space falls away, the earth trembles, and the angels look on astonished as the hymn is sung *"Today is suspended upon the Tree He who suspended the land upon the waters..."* This is a death from which one cannot look away, the Author of Life offering up His life up to agonizing death for the life of the world. And though many may find this remembrance distasteful and misaligned with current sensibilities all who wish to receive the Everlasting Life Jesus promises must first enter into His death.

At every Orthodox baptism the words of St. Paul are remembered; *"Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."* Participation in the death of the Cross is the gateway, and the only one, through which any who wish to celebrate the joy of Pascha must pass. There can be no Resurrection, no celebration of it unless a death has first occurred.

The Lenten season itself offers the faithful Orthodox Christians an opportunity to embrace the Athonite phrase *"if you die before you die, you won't die when you die."* Observe how little effort is required of us. A little fasting, A few more services, A bit of reading. A simple giving of alms. And even these small efforts gravely tax our endurance. The way of the Cross is always taxing, but the joy of the Resurrection beckons!

St. Paul would also write these stirring lines, *"I am crucified with Christ, nevertheless I live; yet not I but Christ lives in me. And the life that I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God who loves me and gave Himself for me."* Great Lent is referred to as "the Arena" wherein our faith is tested. Can we do

battle against our own latent tendencies, our sinful passions, our deadness of spirit and disinterest in the things of God, our attachments to the things of this world?

Living the crucified life in Christ is not a trifling matter and ought not be whimsically discussed. It is easy to apply religious rhetoric and time-worn cliches but these only obfuscate the very real challenge of walking the path of salvation. "Dying before we die" is a lifelong avocation, plagued by fits and starts, many mistakes and disappointments, but also with moments of grace and peace.



Every Lenten journey is different for us; some years seemingly less daunting and others an exhausting grind. Dying to ourselves isn't easy! But through our struggles, the light of the Resurrection dawns and the greater the struggle the greater the victory. Metropolitan Isaiah frequently reminded me that "the victory is in the struggle," and "the intent is the same as the accomplishment."

As we near the end of Great Lent 2025 and prepare ourselves for the rigor of Holy Week, let us "run with patience the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the Author and Finisher of our faith" as St. Paul wrote. Now is the time to put on a burst of speed as would a distance runner at the end of a grueling race. The finish line beckons and we begin to hear the "cloud of witnesses" in the heavens cheering us on! May we run the remainder of the course with our best effort until we sing together "Christ is Risen from the dead!"





Commemoration of The Great and Holy Feast of Pascha

Holy Week comes to an end at sunset of Great and Holy Saturday, as the Church prepares to celebrate her most ancient and preeminent festival, Pascha, the feast of feasts. The time of preparation will give way to a time of fulfillment. The glorious and resplendent light emanating from the empty Tomb will dispel the darkness. Christ, risen from the dead, cracks the fortress of death and takes "captivity captive" (Psalm 67:19). All the limitations of our createdness are torn asunder. Death is swallowed up in victory and life is liberated. "For as by a man came death, by a man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive" (I Corinthians 15:21-22). Pascha is the dawn of the new and unending day. The Resurrection constitutes the most radical and decisive deliverance of humankind.


The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the fundamental truth and absolute fact of the Christian faith. It is the central experience and essential kerygma of the Church. It confirms the authenticity of Christ's remarkable earthly life and vindicates the truth of His teaching. It seals all His redemptive work: His life, the model of a holy life; His compelling and unique teaching; His extraordinary works; and His awesome, life-creating death. Christ's Resurrection is the guarantee of our salvation. Together with His Ascension it brings to perfection God's union with us for all eternity.

The Resurrection made possible the miracle of the Church, which in every age and generation proclaims and affirms "God's plan for the universe, the ultimate divinization of man and the created order." The profound experience of and the unshakable belief in the risen Lord enabled the Apostles to evangelize the world and empowered the Church to overcome paganism. The Resurrection discloses the indestructible power and inscrutable wisdom of God. It disposes of the illusory myths and belief systems by which people, bereft of divine knowledge, strain to affirm the meaning and purpose of their existence. Christ, risen and glorified, releases humanity from the delusions of idolatry. In Him, grave-bound humanity discovers and is filled with incomparable hope. The Resurrection bestows illumination, energizes souls, brings forgiveness, transfigures lives, creates Saints, and gives joy.

The Resurrection has not yet abolished the reality of death. But it has revealed its powerlessness (Hebrews 2:14-15). We continue to die as a result of the Fall. Our bodies decay and fall away. "God allows death to exist but turns it against corruption and its cause, sin, and sets a boundary both to corruption and sin." Thus, physical death does not destroy our life of communion with God. Rather, we move from death to life - from this fallen world to God's reign.

Icon of the Commemoration of Great and Holy Pascha

One of the most symbolic of the Festal Icons of the Orthodox Church is that of the Holy Resurrection. In the center of this radiant event is Christ pulling Adam and Eve up from their tombs. The gates of the Realm of Death are broken and thrown down. Death, personified in human form is defeated, and bound hand and foot at the bottom of the scene. We recall the joyous words of St. Paul: "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" (1 Corinthians 15:55)



In the background stands the host of the departed, so numerous they cannot be depicted. Among them in the front of the multitude are some of the righteous dead, though now invigorated by the Resurrection. King David and his son Solomon are seen on the left wearing crowns. Near the center is Saint John the Baptist. On the other side is Abel, the son of Adam and the first man to ever die. He wears a shepherd's robe and has a cane. Many Icons of this subject depict large crowds with a few other recognizable prophets.




