## A Message from Father Alexander

#### **Trust Not in Princes**



We have come to the moment we've all been waiting for, some of us pinning our every hope on this month, will we see our savior come? Will my pick for political office win and therefore everything in the world be righted again? Will the proposition I want to pass go forward and all will be good in the world? Perhaps you pick up on my sarcasm (perhaps you don't and I would like you to) but I want you to examine your initial reaction to those questions and statements. Have we been waiting for November 5 as a moment where "things will get better?"

As I reminded us as a community a few months ago, we should put no such trust in our government or any other entity besides God. Even if my party and ideals win 100% on November 5 I still will be a sinner, I still will need to pray, in fact once again, my life will probably change in no meaningful way. I may be expecting this weight to be lifted but there will still be division in this world, there

will still be fights, one side will claim injustice and the other victory and we will continue on our way as a country divided.

Perhaps you see this as immensely cynical and maybe it is, but let's examine the "best case scenario." My party and candidates win and the other side graciously admits defeat and they work together to create a better country. Where does that leave me personally? Will that finally grant me inner peace? Unity in myself and with others? Eternal life? At best you'll get one of those and it won't be the last and most important one and that is BEST case scenario.

When we replace God with country or politics we find no peace as evidenced by the previous 8-12 years especially. We read in Psalm 145, "Put not your trust in princes and in the sons of men in whom there is no salvation. His breath shall go forth from him and he shall return to his earth. On that day all his thoughts shall perish. Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob; his hope is in the Lord His God who made heaven and earth." Who shall we put our every hope and trust in, the one who made the world, who sends down the rain and sun and sustains our life, or the ones who simply seek your vote for more power?

**Step 3:** Complete the paper pledge card and mail to the church office or bring to Stewardship Sunday to be blessed at the altar.



### STEWARDSHIP 101 FAQs



#### Q: Why do I need to fill out a new pledge card every year?

**A:** This is a question I get asked a lot by both new and established parishioners. While it may seem repetitive to some, there is a method to the madness I promise you!

First, it's important to understand that this is standard practice at most churches and definitely the established protocol at all Greek Orthodox churches. This is an expectation set forth not by Holy Trinity, but by the Archdiocese.

Why is this an Archdiocese protocol, you may ask? Because it is important that once a year we take a moment to reflect and take stock on our financial commitment to our church.

Our circumstances change. We may move, change jobs, start a family, become empty nesters or retire and thus, our financial situation changes as well. Our annual commitment should reflect this.

#### Q: How much should I pledge?

A: The Bible is clear and asks us to tithe which is giving 10% of our income to the church. We lovingly ask that each of us give our "fair share." If you can afford to give more we hope you feel called to do so. For those who are unable then we ask that you give what you can. Each year, it is important that we take a moment to truly reflect on our financial commitment and give sacrificially. This is one of the most significant aspects of why our Stewardship is done on an annual basis.

#### Q: Why do I need to be a Steward?

A: In order to be a "steward in good standing" one must complete a pledge card each year and make a financial contribution toward that pledge.

One must be a "Steward in good standing" in order to vote during a parish assembly, run for a seat on the parish council or be an officer in a church ministry.

The Archdiocese understands that when we are invested financially in our parish we are more active and involved.

"For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

Matthew 6:21

#### Q: Is Stewardship just about financial giving?

A: Stewardship is made up of three components - time, talent and treasure. In order to be fully engaged and committed to our parish we are called to give not just financially but also of our time and lending our talents to the church when and where they are needed. When we are regularly attending services, active in the ministries and life of the parish and practicing sacrificial financial giving, we then realize the full benefits of being an Orthodox Christian.

### **Entrance of the Theotokos to the Temple**

Commemorated on November 21



The Feast commemorates when as a young child, the Virgin Mary entered the Temple in Jerusalem.

When Mary was three years old, Joachim and Anna decided that the time had come to fulfill their promise and to offer her to the Lord. Joachim gathered the young girls of the neighborhood to form an escort, and he made them go in front of Mary, carrying torches. Captivated by the torches, the young child followed joyfully to the Temple, not once looking back at her parents nor weeping as she was parted from them.

The holy Virgin ran toward the Temple, overtaking her attendant maidens and threw herself into the arms of the High Priest Zacharias, who was waiting for her at the gate of the Temple with the elders. Zacharias blessed her saying, "It is in you that He has glorified your name in every generation. It

is in you that He will reveal the Redemption that He has prepared for His people in the last days."

Then, Zacharias brought the child into the Holy of Holies—a place where only the High Priest was permitted to enter once a year on the Day of Atonement. He placed her on the steps of the altar, and the grace of the Lord descended upon her. She arose and expressed her joy in a dance as wonder seized all who saw this happen.

The Virgin Mary dwelt in the Temple for nine years until, reaching an age for marriage, she was taken from the Temple by the priests and elders and entrusted to Joseph as the guardian of her virginity.

The Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple signifies her total dedication to God and her readiness for her future vocation as the Mother of the Incarnate Lord. This is a feast of anticipation. As honor is shown to Mary, the faithful are called to look forward to the Incarnation of Christ, celebrated in a little more than a month by the Feast of the Nativity on December 25.






#### UNDERSTANDING THE LITURGICAL MUSIC CYCLE OF THE CHURCH





The modes include 1st mode, 2nd mode, 3rd mode, 4th mode, plagal 1st mode, plagal 2nd mode, grave mode, and plagal 4th mode. Each mode expresses the tonality of what is being prayed during the service. The services themselves rely upon service books: Holy Scripture, the Typicon, the Menaion, the Octoechos, the Horologion, the Triodion, the Pentecostarion, the Heirmologion, the Ieratikon, and the Euchologion. With the help of these books, the Vespers, Compline, Midnight Office, Orthros, First Hour, Third Hour, Sixth Hour, and Ninth Hour, are constructed daily. The daily services are significant to pivotal events and holy figures of the Orthodox Church: Sunday celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ; Monday commemorates the bodiless powers; Tuesday recognizes John the Baptist and the prophets; Wednesday venerates the cross and fasts due to the betrayal; Thursday honors the Apostles and St. Nicholas; Friday mourns the crucifixion; and Saturday commemorates the martyrs and contains prayers for the dead. The hymnography is directed on these events and many others that occurred within Holy Scripture and throughout church history from Old to New Testament. The crucial feast days that reset certain liturgical cycles are Pascha and Pentecost, which celebrate Christ's conquering of death by death and opening the Kingdom of Heaven to all through His ministry. The following information regarding the Liturgical Cycle is far more extensive but was covered in detail by Christian during the potluck.
