MOVIE RECOMMENDATIONS




Fans of Wuthering Heights will want to see "Emily," which is now showing in art theatres.

Starring a British cast led by Emma Mackey as Emily Bronte, this is far from an action-packed speed chase. Rather, it's a dark, atmospheric slow-paced glimpse into the lives of Emily, her grim father, her sisters Charlotte and Ann and their brother Bromwell.

While the whole family is depicted as brilliant but strange, Emily is the focus for the viewer's attention because she's been labeled by family and neighbors as the misfit recluse. She sadly dies at the age of 30, having written some of the greatest poetry and fiction in English literature.

Those of us who went to the Bronte home in Haworth on our 2015 tour will recognize many of the locations in the film. Rating: R



Coming Soon: "The Lost King"

March 24 will bring the initial screening at AMC theaters of "*The Lost King*," the true story of the 2012 discovery of the remains of Richard III.

Richard's remains had been lost for more than 500 years. Then in 2012, thanks to one amateur historian's obsession, and eventual funding from the government, Richard was found buried beneath a parking lot in a shopping mall. This film, starring Oscar winner Sally Hopkins as well as Steve Coogan, tells that story.

On September 6, our tour will be visiting the site of the discovery, so you may want to check out this film which will be in limited release starting March 24. Rating: PG

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WHAT MAKES OUR TOURS SPECIAL?

Led by Mary Valentine, a retired community college instructor and an Anglophile who has visited the UK more than 50 times since 1988, our twice-yearly tours focus on themes and locations that will fascinate participants, whether this is their first visit or one of many.

"I look for off-the-beatentrack locations and events. In the last few years, for example, we've spent a day at cooking school making Cornish pasties; spent a day on the moors tracing the steps of the Bronte sisters who wrote some of the greatest novels in English literature; gone underground in one of the tin mines seen in Poldark; visited locations from Bridgerton; and played croquet on the lawn at Thomas Hardy's home."



DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

Note: This information is accurate as of today's publication. Covid outbreaks and schedule changes beyond our control may require some minor tweaking before September.

September 3: Tour begins. We'll start at Buckingham Palace's State Rooms and Kensington Palace's "Court to Couture" exhibition which compares royal and red carpet looks, including items worn during the reign of Richard II and gowns worn more recently by Lady Gaga and Lizzo. Finally, we'll stop at Battersea Power Station which has recently been converted into a shopping and cultural center.

September 4: We'll start the day taking a boat from Westminster Pier to Greenwich where we'll explore the Royal Naval College with its extraordinary Painted Ceiling, as well as the Prime Meridian. Back in London we'll walk to the Garden Museum, stopping along the way to see the National Covid Memorial Wall.

September 5: Our luxury coach will take us to Oxford where we'll explore the universities and fabulous architecture and then go punting along the river.

Next, we'll stop at the Back-to-Backs in Birmingham.

Carefully restored and atmospheric, these 19th century homes illustrate living conditions for the working classes and the poor in that era..

September 6: Today we'll visit the spot where King Richard III was found in 2012 after 500 years being lost. Then we'll head to Stoneywell, an arts and crafts center featuring a restored home furnished in the styles of the arts and crafts movement (1880-1920). Stoneywell is the site used in the BBC series *Make It at Market. Note: You can view this series here in the US on IMDb and Britbox. Warning: This show is addictive.*

September 7: Our first stop will be at Chatsworth. Chatsworth House, home to the Cavendish family for five centuries, is known for its Painted Hall, state rooms, and sculpture gallery.



September 8: We'll spend a half-day in Liverpool. Liverpool is the home to an extraordinary remodeled library that combines old and new architecture styles. Also in Liverpool is the Museum of Slavery, as well as the city's own impressive museum. After Liverpool, we'll make a stop at Middleport Pottery, home of much of England's finest pottery, in Stoke on Trent. Then we'll set off for the Cotswolds.

September 9: In the morning we'll stop at Stow-on-the-Wold, a beautiful Cotswold town where you can ramble and do some shopping. In the afternoon, we'll enjoy Giffords Circus, an annual countryside event.

September 10: We've scheduled a wine tasting in Surrey in the heart of England's wine growing region. Then it's on to our London hotel. We'll have one final dinner together before ending our tour. Our hotel is only a couple hundred feet from the train that will take you to Heathrow in twenty minutes on the 11th.

All breakfasts, an afternoon tea, and all but one dinner are paid for by the tour. You are responsible for your lunches and one dinner. We'll always be near places at lunchtime where you can find something to eat.
