LAO REPORT

The Maryland legislative season is in high gear. Two bills of particular concern to YCM members are HB0719 and SB0168.

SB0168 (the bill to restrict Confined Aquatic Disposal(CAD)) has received a favorable vote with amendments by the Senate Committee on Education, Energy, and the Environment. Board member Carl Treff reports that there was committee action on SB0168 that just transpired recently. Since the Port offered a compromise letter to halt any CAD for at least four years, Senator Simonaire, with our community consent, amended SB0168 to add the same four years to make it official. The amendment also included striking the "within 5 miles of an overburdened community" and changed to "no CAD anywhere in the bay". The amendment was carried and the bill will now go to the Senate floor. If it passes muster there, it will cross over to the House.

HB0719 which includes the increase to the registration fees we pay every two years has received favorable committee support and has passed the third House reading and should go to the Senate soon for a vote. We'll stay on top of these bills as the session winds down.

Protocol Matters

As Opening Season approaches, our clubs are planning their ceremonies, which often include "Honor Guards" consisting of uniformed persons lining up to salute visiting clubs and special guests. An "Honor Guard", typically consists of four, six, or eight people standing two, three or four on each side, respectively. Formal yacht club ceremonies reflect a symbolic "coming aboard" where the club senior official or special guest exchanges salutes, passes through the honor guard, salutes the ensign (national flag), and then exchanges salutes with the "Officer-of-the-Watch" (also known as the Officer of the Deck), which is usually the host club Commodore.

Honor Guards are provided, per club invitation, from a highly respected organization able to provide uniformed personnel familiar with rendering honors. Groups asked to provide Honor Guards include but are not limited to the American Legion, Coast Guard Auxilliary, Power Squadron, Shriners, Scouts, American Legion, and the US Military. In appreciation, the host club provides a donation to the group or worthy purpose supported by the group.

In cases where a visiting Honor Guard is not available, uniformed yacht club officers may be asked to volunteer.

In nautical ceremonies, the "Honor Guard" protocol evolved from the use of "side-boys". In the old sailing days, the nautical tradition of *Piping the side* originated in the method of arrival onboard of visiting captains and admirals, frequently portly gentlemen, who were often hoisted onboard from a small boat while the boatswain passed orders to the men with his boatswain's call. In those days, coming aboard a ship meant either climbing up a rope ladder or being hoisted aboard in a boatswain's chair. In response to the call, the men would assemble to form a side party to provide help as needed.

The number of "side-boys" needed was a factor of the weight of the person being hoisted in, and not unusual for the higher the rank, the more side-boys needed. When the visitor was safely hoisted aboard, the side-boys would salute the visitor, who would return their salute prior to greeting the Officer-of-the-Deck. If the hoist was not needed, the side-boys would salute as soon as the visitor's head appeared above the quarter deck. The side-boys and the visitor hold their salutes until the visitor completely passes through the side-boy ranks.

The number of people in the honor guard is often based on availability of persons from a local group to do the honors. Eight is ideal and presents the highest honor, but it is not considered a protocol mistake by the host club if only four or six can be stationed. Never station less than four or more than eight and always station an even number.

- Introduction to Boating Types of boats, boating vocabulary, sailboats, paddle craft, power boats, and engine types.
- Boating Law Boat registration, regulations, hull identification numbers, required safety equipment, Federal boating laws, state boating laws, and reporting accidents.
- Safety Equipment Life jackets, fire extinguishers, sound-producing devices, visual distress signals, anchors, and other safety equipment.
- Safe Operation and Navigation Buoys and beacons, aids to navigation, navigation rules, docking, and the dangers of alcohol on the water.
- Boating Emergencies Hypothermia, boating accidents, man overboard, capsizing, emergency radio calls, carbon monoxide dangers, and weather.
- Trailering Types of trailers, lights, hitches, towing a trailer.
- Sports and Boating Water-skiing, hunting & hunting gear, PWC operation, and other boating tips.

Students must attend both days to complete the 8 hours as required by MD DNR for anyone born on or after July 1, 1972 who operates a motorized vessel on the state waterways.
