LAO REPORT

So far, I've examined the lists of bills pre-filed for the 2025 Maryland Legislative Session. While we've given the Department of Natural Resources the YCM position on any registration fee increase, I've not seen a fee increase bill pre-filed yet. We'll continue to monitor this situation. The legislative session begins on January 8.

There are a number of bills pre-filed that may affect how to handle boating accidents, crabbing licenses and also affect fishing. The text of those bills is not yet available. We will examine the text as soon as it's available and let you know about any impacts..

On the good news front, many of you may already know that full funding of the Key Bridge replacement is approved and construction activities will begin this month.

Meantime, I hope the new year is going well for all.

Protocol Matters

Yacht Club Uniforms - Black Sweaters

The traditional yacht club uniform is the mariners' uniform that evolved from the early 19th century to the present. Variations of the uniform are worn around the world by professional and amateur mariners from water taxi captains to merchant mariners and naval personnel. Amateur mariners such as members of the yacht club community often look to naval regulations and traditions because of the naval attention to detail and dedication to wearing uniforms in the best possible light.

YCM and many member clubs have adopted the Black V Neck Sweater as a uniform option. Yacht clubs and the US Navy use the Black V Neck Sweater both indoors and outdoors for wear in lieu of the Service Dress Blue (SDB) coat (the traditional name for the black coat worn in the winter with white shirt, tie, and black pants). Navy Regs state, "The sweater is authorized for daily wear to and from work, in public places and for attending working level meetings/briefings, but is not authorized for ceremonies, high level meetings/briefings, or when conducting business on Capitol Hill"

Consistent with Navy practice, yachting organizations have allowed the Commodore or ranking officer to call for the black sweater in informal situations (e.g. when business casual in acceptable). For major yachting ceremonies, formal occasions, and funerals, the SDB coat is the most proper call. Following these same guidelines, on informal occasions where the "Salt and Pepper" yachting uniform is worn, the black sweater may be used in lieu of the SDB Jacket.

The sweater is considered a complete uniform alternative and therefore must be worn with the white shirt and tie called for in the SDB uniform. "No tie" is "out of uniform", but yachting organizations may allow ties to be removed in casual situations where the person is <u>not engaged in official business and the Commodore or Officer-in-Charge has given approval</u>. If a club or organization has a uniformed Duty Officer or "Officer of the Day", that person is on official business and should never remove their tie.

Rank insignia is depicted on the Black V Neck Sweater by epaulettes that slip onto shoulder straps. Badges, pins, buttons, etc worn on the SBD jacket are <u>not</u> worn on the sweater. For practical reasons, yachting organizations may authorize one name plate to be worn. The US Navy does this by a patch sewn onto the sweater. The patch will usually contain name, rank, and <u>one</u> of the specialty insignia held by the wearer. Yachting organizations may do the same, but the group must pick a way and do it consistently.

Yachting organizations may also elect to add a burgee on the sweater. Typically, the burgee will be on the left and the nameplate or patch on the right, following the yacht club "right rank" rule and the practical reason to place the name forward when shaking hands in greeting.




