Legislative Affairs Officer's Report

May has arrived and we are busy readying our boats for summer cruising and preparing our club houses for Yacht Cub Openings. So far, the Openings and respective Friday/Saturday night parties have been lots of fun despite the cooler, rainy weather that occurred on those weekends.

The Maryland General "Asylum" has concluded, and the norm has prevailed with little accomplished for industrious, law-abiding citizens. Unfortunately, the Key Bridge disaster may be the main reasons Annapolis did not follow their traditional practice of raising taxes and creating more government regulations on many now economically stressed citizens and small businesses. At least a few representatives stated Marylanders should be ready for a surge of taxes and regulations during the 2025 session! Are you going to question your representatives about this? For whom are you voting?

With that did you know, easily found on the net, Maryland is the seventh-most expensive state in the United States. Overall, prices are 24% higher than the national average, while housing prices are 66% higher. A typical single-family home in the state costs \$366,581.
