Legislative Affairs Officer's Report

DNR Secretary Josh Kurtz recently advised that it is time for Maryland to re-assert itself as an innovator and leader on strategies to improve the health of the Chesapeake Bay.

In October, Governor Wes Moore was unanimously elected to serve as chair of the bipartisan, multi-state <u>Chesapeake Executive Council</u>, the primary policy and leadership body of the formal Chesapeake Bay Partnership's effort to restore the Bay. That month, DNR Secretary Josh Kurtz was also appointed to chair the Council's Principal Staff Committee, which sets the agenda and briefs the Council.

The Council consists of governors from the Chesapeake Bay states, the D.C. Mayor, and EPA officials. During the next year, the Council will re-evaluate Bay cleanup plans and ensure states are implementing the most effective ways to reduce agricultural and urban stormwater runoff—the great pollution challenge facing the Chesapeake. As Governor Moore has stressed, a key part of this effort will include improving our partnerships and holding each other accountable to ensure progress is happening.

The next few years will be a particularly pivotal time. This year marks the 40th Anniversary of the original Chesapeake Bay Agreement and 2022 marked the 50th anniversary of the federal Clean Water Act. While Maryland has made much progress over the past 40 years—in particular by halting the long-term decline of the Bay—Maryland has not made sufficient progress, and now know that the watershed states will not meet the collective nutrient and sediment reduction goals by 2025.

Past government leaders established those goals in 2010 based on scientific research that determined reducing 2009 levels of nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment by about 20 to 25 percent would enable states to meet water quality standards that allow fish, shellfish, and other marine life to flourish.

The Department of Natural Resources is in the process of aligning how the department provides grant funding for projects, where Maryland conserves and restores land, and how the state re-builds habitat to conform with the latest science related to improving Bay water quality.

This new focus includes locating water quality improvement projects in specific areas with the most potential to improve wildlife habitat. Maryland is looking to develop more living shorelines to add nursery habitat for marine life and protect coastlines from rising sea levels. The state is planting 5 million new trees over the next 10 years to soak up polluted runoff and protect land from erosion. This focus on habitats also aims to bolster striped bass, blue crab populations, and expand habitat for birds and other wildlife

on land. Water quality improvement work will also improve fishing and hunting opportunities in the state.

The goal is to think at the scale of the entire Bay, but act in those smaller areas of the Chesapeake watershed, in locations where the state is going to get the most improvement for our efforts.

Another new Maryland Department of Natural Resources project is aiming to raise imperiled freshwater mussels and restore them to waters of the Susquehanna River basin—all from the back of a trailer.

DNR's Mobile Mussel Propagation Trailer began operations this October. It is currently parked in Susquehanna State Park and is raising juvenile mussels from the Susquehanna River, where the mollusks play an important role in filtering water, just as oysters do in saltwater.

Though some other research groups have trucks or vehicles to assist in mussel research, none are this size or operate as a fully functional hatchery.

"At this point, it's one of a kind, no one else has this," Matt Ashton, a DNR natural resources biologist who helps run the operations in the trailer, said at the public unveiling of the hatchery during DNR Science Week in October.

Zach Taylor, DNR freshwater mussel hatchery manager, said the hatchery will play an important role in public outreach because staff can tow it to different locations and educate residents about the importance of freshwater mussels. The hatchery will also reduce travel and handling stress in returning the broodstock of mussels back to the river. "In general, the less stress we can put on mussels the better," Taylor said.

Protocol Matters

Parliamentary Pointers for the Chair

Happy Thanksgiving! At this time of year there are a lot of new Commodores at our member clubs, which means they have to chair formal meetings. A very useful parliamentary bit of advice to new Commodores who have limited experience as Chairs of formal meetings is: "If you see that the Board or General Membership clearly agrees with a request or action, you say "Without objection, the Board approves/directs/agrees _______." (If there is an objection, you state, "May I have a motion?") Most routine business and requests by members can be disposed of this way. It speeds the meeting along.! When a decision is without objection, the Secretary records the decision by writing "The Board (or Membership) agreed/approved/directed that _____." Another useful thing to keep in mind is that as Chair, it is your duty to remain impartial. That is why you do not voice or hand vote except to break ties. However, because your vote will not be known and therefore cannot influence the Board or General Membership, you do vote on all ballot votes (General Membership - because you are a member of the organization, Board because you are a voting member of the Board). You should not hold your ballot but instead cast it in with all the others.

You should never argue for or against a motion while you sit as Chair. If you want to be in on the debate, you may hand over the Gavel to another that has no position for the duration of discussion on the motion. On most matters and motions, some leeway is tolerated in clubs because people usually want to hear the position of the club Commodore or President.

Finally, a common situation you will deal with as Chair is members wanting to modify a motion on the floor. When that happens, first look to the maker of the motion and second. If they <u>both</u> agree to the changes, then the motion is modified, and you may proceed to further discussion (if any) and vote. If they do not agree, a motion to amend the main motion and a second are required. After discussion (if any), a vote on the motion to amend is taken. Business then returns to the main motion (as amended if the vote carries).


