### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

Southeast Museum has partnered with the Brewster Public Library to facilitate monthly History Exchange and History Book Club meetings. History Exchange has been extremely popular, attracting such local history experts such as Vincent D'Aquino, author of two books on Sybil Ludington, Fleur Fairman, researcher of the Stone Chambers of Putnam County, Jack Duncan, Brewster military expert, and Jennifer Cassidy, Putnam County Historian, who will present at November's meeting.

Southeast Museum has provided local history presentations, designed to enrich the NYS social studies curriculum, for grades K-5 at the Brewster School District throughout the academic year, covering such topics as The Stone Chambers of Putnam County, Putnam County: Then and Now, Heroes of Putnam County, and The Fourth Grade Colonial Fair. These events have been well received by the students, faculty and Administration, and will continue to evolve throughout the 2024-2025 school year. A program designed to bring students to the Old Doansburg one room schoolhouse to learn about the history of the educators and students who attended this school is in the research state for the 2025-26 academic year.

Southeast Museum is collaborating with the Brewster Chamber of Commerce and the Putnam County Historian on its major exhibit scheduled to premiere on March 19, 2025: The History of Business in Brewster. Lifelong residents and business owners have been interviewed and recorded in order to paint an authentic picture of what Main Street businesses

provided throughout the nineteenth, twentieth, and twentyfirst centuries.

Interviews with Daniel Ledley, Alexandra Johnson, niece of Brewster Standard Editor, Marjorie Addis; Bob Salinger; David Bruen, Jr.; Bob Ocskasy of Brewster Glass; Carol Bailey; John Crawford, son of Joan Crawford, former archivist of the Southeast Museum; Suzanne Freigan of Putnam County Savings Bank; the late Joseph Ciccilanti; the Ryder Family; Anne Koplik; as well as Latina business owner Maria Quezads of Six Diamonds Tree Services, have yielded a plethora of information regarding the past and present businesses of Brewster, including Oxman's Stationary, Benny's, The Cameo Theater, Hope's Drug Store, and Goosen's Furniture. These interviews are being transcribed in order to build an oral history program in collaboration with The Brewster Public Library. At a recent Greater Hudson Heritage Network conference, I learned of a philanthropic organization called Bloomberg Connects, which will supply recording equipment and technical support to create a virtual tour of our museum that will enable people to view our exhibits by clicking on a link on our website.



Southeast Museum received grants from the Putnam Arts Council, Tompkins Bank, The Brewster Rotary Club, M&T Bank, The Putnam County Savings Bank, and the Brewster Fire Department that allowed us to host an evening of history and music on September 7th, featuring local blues and pentecostal artist Joshua Brittingham in collaboration with the Southeast Museum Director of Education, who narrated a slideshow honoring prominent African American residents of the Hudson Valley throughout history. These multiple grants enabled the museum to purchase a projector and a screen that will be used to provide

future slideshow presentations, most notably the oral history program mentioned previously.

The museum collaborated with the Putnam History Museum to host an art exhibit that premiered on October 18th, featuring local artists' portravals of the women of the Hudson Valley who contributed to the American Revolution. This exhibit will come to the Southeast Museum following its run in Cold Spring throughout November. This was the kickoff event to Rev250, Putnam County's celebration of the 250th birthday of our nation.

Southeast Museum has contracted with Master It Media. Maggie Carey, president of this company, has created a new website for the museum, which enables residents to purchase online tickets for upcoming events. Maggie is establishing links on the website that will allow visitors to view the Tilly Foster Mine mineral exhibit as well as an upcoming slideshow on the East Branch Reservoir. Both of these digital exhibits were created by Brewster High School students.

In the area of outreach programs to underserved populations, the Southeast Museum has presented to the Southeast Seniors at their clubhouse overlooking Lake Tonetta, has opened their museum space for visits followed by lunch for a



group from Careers Support Solutions in Carmel and a group from Artis Senior Living in Somers in their museum space, and "a business mentoring group" with "SCORE business mentoring group.





Finally, the museum looks forward to its second annual collaboration with our downstairs neighbors, The Coalition for the Arts, in presenting A Festival of Trees, which invites community organizations to sponsor and decorate holiday trees in the upstairs theater space. Last year's festive event hosted families with such holiday treats as hot chocolate with Santa, tree ornament craft making, and a caroling procession down Main Street to the tree lighting across the street from the railroad depot. This year's Festival of Trees is scheduled for December 7th, from 4:00-7:00.

The success of these exhibits and presentations have come about through the collaboration with community organizations. Southeast Museum has benefited from these partnerships and will continue to do so as we move forward in exploring new opportunities to provide local history educational programming and community events.

This exhibit featured works by local artists which explored the roles of women in the Hudson Valley during the American Revolution. Sybil Ludington, Deborah Sampson are among the women portrayed in this exhibit.

We've been hard at researching, interviewing, and assembling our long anticipated History of Business in Brewster exhibit, in conjunction with the Southeast Chamber of Commerce, now set to open on March 19, 2025.
