HISTORY FACT- A.P. Giannini

The City of San Francisco Recognized the 150th Birthday of A.P. Giannini, Founder, Bank of America on Wednesday, May 6, 2020. On April 28, 2020, Supervisor Catherine Stefani introduced a resolution commemorating the 150th birthday of A.P. Giannini, Founder, Bank of America. The resolution received a formal vote during the Supervisors meeting on Tuesday, May 5.

Supervisor Stefani was moved to introduce this resolution after a meeting in March with representatives from the Museo Italo Americano in San Francisco. Currently located at the Fort Mason Center, the Museo has embarked on a capital campaign to renovate a building on Battery Street to serve as its new home that will include a new permanent exhibit saluting the achievements of Italian immigrants in California that will be dedicated to the memory of A.P. Giannini.

In addition, on Wednesday, May 6, the official **150th birthday of Giannini**, the lights of San Francisco City Hall were lit in the colors of the Italian flag in memory of Giannini. The resolution recognized A. P. Giannini for his substantial contributions to San Francisco history, Italian American culture. The son of Italian immigrants, Amadeo Peter (A. P.) Giannini was born on May 6, 1870. He had a long legacy of business innovation, scientific inquiry, civic engagement, disaster response, and immigrant rights in San Francisco. In 1904, Giannini founded the Bank of Italy. From the beginning, he expressly sought to make loans to immigrants, farmers, small businesses, women and minorities because they were systematically excluded from other financial institutions.

In 1906, when the great earthquake struck San Francisco, Giannini personally rescued the bank's gold and currency, and his was the first bank to resume operations. Giannini famously set up shop on a plank over two barrels on a street corner, and started lending money to those in need. By 1923, he was so successful that he was able to merge the Bank of Italy with the Los Angeles bank known as Bank of America and became the CEO. Shortly after the passage of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, Giannini created the country's first bank by and for women, the Women's Banking Department—a bank within the bank that gave women access to their own checking and lending accounts, where they could manage their finances without the involvement of their spouses. In 1930, the Bank of Italy was officially renamed the Bank of America, and would soon become the largest banking institution in the world. Giannini helped nurture the motion picture, technology and wine industries in California with his investments, and loaned Walt Disney the funds to produce Snow White, the first full length, animated motion picture to be made in the United States, and also provided capital to William Hewlett and David Packard to help form Hewlett-Packard, which helped established the information technology and computing industry in the Bay Area, and he would finance the construction of the Golden Gate Bridge during the Great Depression. On his 75th birthday, May 6, 1945, Giannini created and endowed the A. P. Giannini Foundation with a personal gift of nearly \$500,000 to support innovative research.


