

Devil's Slide Trail Hike Pop-up Event

Please join IAWG for a hike along the beautiful **Devil's Slide Trail** in Pacifica on **Wednesday September 30th at 10:30**. We will meet at the South parking lot just south of the Tom Lantos Tunnel. Parking is accessible from both the northbound and southbound lanes on Highway 1. Devil's Slide Trail in Pacifica is a 1.3-mile (2.8-mile round trip) paved, multi-use path built from the former Highway 1 stretch, with benches and interpretive signs and views over the rocky Pacific coast. The hike will be 2.8 miles round trip and has an elevation gain of 357 feet over its 2.8 mile out and back paved route. Please wear comfortable shoes, bring water bottles if you like. Bring a jacket as it may get chilly and foggy along the trail. We will take rest breaks along the way and walk at a moderate pace.

After our walk, we will drive a short distance to **High Tide cafe** in the **Pedro Point Shopping Center in Pacifica** to have lunch. Participation in lunch is not mandatory if you would prefer just the hike. It is a short distance from the south trail parking lot. The food is good and reasonably priced.

Overview of Devil's Slide Trail

Devil's Slide Trail is a 1.3-mile paved, multi-use path located in Pacifica, California. This trail was created from a former segment of Highway 1, which was known for its treacherous conditions due to landslides. The trail offers stunning views of the rocky Pacific coast and is suitable for hikers, bikers, and equestrians.

Features of the Trail

Amenities

Benches: Available for resting and enjoying the views.

Interpretive Signs: Provide information about the area's history and geography.

Parking: We will be meeting at the South parking lot just past the Tom Lantos Tunnel going south through the tunnel.

Restrooms: Located at both trailheads. Drinking Fountains: Available for trail users.

Accessibility

The trail is designed for various users, including families and those with pets (dogs on leashes). Separate lanes for hikers and cyclists enhance safety.

Devil's Slide Trail is an excellent spot for wildlife observation. Visitors can see:
