## **Effects of Excessive Blood Loss** Possible D E A T H . Reduced blood volume . Confusion . Tachycardia . Possible brain damage . Lowered haemoglobin





Effects of Excessive Blood Loss - continued Lowered haemoglobin

predisposes to:

Anaemia, physical weakness, pallor, Short of breath when physically active, May faint easily, profoundly fatigued, Lassitude, loss of appetite, fever-prone **Diminished breast milk, must drink water** Needs to complement baby feeds (formula) Needs domestic help ++ rest and sleep



Effects of Excessive Blood Loss - continued Lowered haemoglobin predisposes to: Infection-prone + not clearing up quickly **Costly medications, needs help with baby** And other children, relationships strained **Easily disheartened, fragile temperament** May be at risk of post-natal depression Long term effects include: unfitness for work, fear of pregnancy / labour, signs + symptoms of premature aging, hormone disturbances.

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
