Rd 2 QLD - NSW SPRINT CHALLENGE

The second round of the QLD_NSW Sprint Challenge was conducted at Carnell Raceway, Stanthorpe. The two day event of super sprints and short circuit racing produced some of the best racing seen at the raceway for some time.

On the sprint side of the event Ross Rundle in his 2017 Minetti SS-V1 won Racing Cars & Open Sports Cars outright and the Sports Cars Under 1500cc class with a time of 2 minutes 17.280 seconds. Second outright and second in the Sports Cars Under 1500cc was Bruce Chamberlain in his 2015 Minetti SS-V1 with a time of 2 minutes 23.874 seconds. Third outright and first in the Sports Cars 1500cc – 2000cc class was Darren Brent driving a 2016 Mazda MX5 with a time 2 minutes 18.042 seconds.

Chris Ching driving a 1999 Mitsubishi Lancer EVO VI RS won the Closed Sports Cars & Sedans outright and the All-Wheel Drive Vehicles Under 4000cc with a time of 2 minutes 25.876 seconds. Second outright and first in the Sports Cars Over 3000cc was Neil Esplin in his 2019 Toyota Supra with a time of 2 minutes 33.837 seconds. Shane Hill in his 1991 Nissan Silvia was third outright and first in Sports Sedans Over 2000cc.

Nick Contojohn driving his 1999 Subaru WRX Sti was second in the All-Wheel Drive Vehicles Under 4000cc with a time of 2 minutes 32.321 seconds.

Making her first appearance at Stanthorpe Christina Poole in her 2003 Subaru Impreza came third in class with a time of 2 minutes 47.676 seconds.

Ainsley Fitzgerald in his 2014 Arrow Clubman came second in the Sports Cars 1500cc – 2000cc class with a time 2 minutes 33.032 seconds. Third in class driving a 2018 Formula Motor Sport Clubman was Ian Fitzpatrick with a time of 2 minutes 36.534 seconds.

Second in the Sports Cars Over 3000cc class was Blake Morgan driving a 1999 Mazda MX5 with a time of 2 minutes 31.505 seconds. Third in the class was Brett Kirkland sharing the drive with Blake Morgan with a time of 2 minutes 39.249 seconds.

Second in the Sports Sedans Over 2000cc was Ross Liddle driving a 1999 Honda Civic with a time 2 minutes 33.170 seconds. Third in class was Sean Hill driving his 1992 Nissan Silvia with a time of 2 minutes 34.446 seconds.

Neil Thompson driving his 1972 Toyota Corolla won the Improved Production Under 1600cc class with a time 2 minutes 43.805 seconds. Second was Graeme Fleming in his 1992 Toyota Corolla GTI with a time of 2 minutes 49.680 seconds.

William Contojohn driving a 1992 Nissan Pulsar won the Improved Production Cars 1600cc – 2000cc class with a time of 2 minutes 39.933 seconds. Second in class was Neil Cope in his 1989 Peugeot 205 GTI with a time of 2 minutes 42.368 seconds.

The Improved Production 2000cc- 3000cc was a family affair with Peyton Penboss driving a 1982 Mazda 3 SP23 taking out first spot with a time of 2 minutes 47.462 seconds. Second was Ashley Penboss sharing the drive with Peyton with a time 2 minutes 48.064 seconds.

The Improved Production 3000 – 4000cc class was taken out by Craig Manteufel in his 1984 Holden Commodore with his a time of 2 minutes 40.074 seconds. Matthew White in a 2004 Nissan Skyline took out second spot with a time of 2 minutes 41.780 seconds. Sharing the drive Brendon Wrigley took out third place with a time 2 minutes 42.365 seconds. Sharing the drive Neville Nawratzki driving a 1999 Holden VT Commodore took out the Improved Production Over 4500cc with a time of 2 minutes 33.534 seconds. Chantal Holborn took out second place with a time of 2 minutes 37.867 seconds.

Leonard Griffiths driving his 1984 Holden Commodore took out the Short Circuit Vehicles. Alan Greenbury in a 1963 Hillman Imp took out the Pre 1974 Classic Touring Cars Under 1300cc class, while Keith Edwards in a 1953 Morris Minor took out the 1974 Classic Touring Cars 1300cc – 1600cc class with a time of 2 minutes 54.698 seconds.

Second was Holly Aspinall in a 1999 Honda Civic with a time of 2 minutes 47.945 seconds. Emily Clarke driving a 1999 Hyundai Excel claimed third spot with 2 minutes 48.363 seconds.

The short circuit racing at the weekend produced some very close finishes in the eight lap events. Toowoomba's Dallas Wolff staged a running battle with Nambour's Shane Hill and Munruben's Paul Bond to finish the weekend with 32 points. Paul Bond finished a close second with 31 points and Shane Hill with 30 points.

The event took the form of a fun day, due to entrants being down. Top racing was experienced throughout the day and if this is any indication of what is to come this season then motor sport enthusiasts are in for one very exciting year.

The class racing was conducted on a point's basis with trophies being handed out to the various winners at the end of the day's racing.

The Junior Class attracted a strong field, and was won in fine style by the young Stanthorpe driver Nicholas Poole who was in top form. Second place was taken out by the promising young Rebecca Dawes from Warwick who showed that with more experience she will be the one to beat. Toowoomba's lan Ford took out third place on the day.

Murray Parker, another local driver who has come out of retirement, returned to the winner's circle after winning the Sports Sedan class, Terry Kelly picked up second place with Graeme Kelly third.
