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QLD & NSW DRIVERS DO BATTLE FOR THE COVETED SHIELD

The Short Circuit Motor Sport Association returned to Warwick's Morgan Park Raceway at the end of February for the running of Rd 1 of the QLD-NSW Sprint Challenge and Rd 1 of the Short Circuit Touring Car Series. It is 12 months since the Association has conducted an event due to COVID which proved to be a wonderful success.

The event attracted some of the best sprint competitors from both States while the Touring Car competitors produced some door handle to door handle racing. The racing over the two days could only be described as great.

The event consisted of two competitions, the first round of the 2021 Qld – NSW Sprint Challenge and the first round of the 2021 Queensland Short Circuit Touring Car Series. The touring car events were action packed in the four classes. The class for under 2 litre Improved Production was highly contested and was fought out between two young drivers, Brisbane's Tom Brelsford in a 1976 Ford Escort MK11 and Gold Coast's Jett Johnson in a 1998 Hyundai Excel. After heat 3 Tom Brelsford was leading in points, but did not contest Heat 4. At the end of the weekend Tom Brelsford and Jett Johnson were both on 39 points, and Warwick's Nathan Locke in a 1975 Datsun 120Y Coupe was second on 23 points, Brisbane's Sophia Buccini driving a 1998 Proton Satria GTI was third on 22 points.

The over 2 litre Improved Production class again produced some close racing. The class win went to Brisbane driver Paul Buccini in a 2006 BMW 130i on 26 points after a running battle with another Brisbane competitor Luke Beveridge, in a 2006 BMW 130i, who took second place on 19 points. Placid Hills' Guy Nawratzki in a 1982 Holden Commodore on 18 points followed closely in third spot.

The super sprint event was run over four timed laps on the 1500 metre track saw some very interesting competition between competitors in the various classes being contested. The fastest competitor over a four lap heat in the Racing Cars and Open Sport Cars was Noosa's Bruce Chamberlain in a 2015 Minetti SSV1 with his fastest heat being 3 minutes 12.239 seconds. Cleveland's Brian Pettit was second in the 1995 Westfield Clubman SE with a time of 3 minutes 24.782 seconds. Brisbane's Ross Rundle in a 2017 Minetti SS-V1 was third with 3 minutes 25.465 seconds,



NSW competitors dominated in the Closed Sports Cars and Sedans. Fastest was Mark Stevens from Sawtell in a 1999 Holden Commodore with his fastest heat being 3 minutes 20.015 seconds. Coffs Harbour's David Wedd in a 2001 Holden Commodore was second with a time of 3 minutes 20.765 seconds. Another Coffs

Harbour competitor Graeme Hardaker in a 2005 Subaru WRX was third with a time of 3 minutes 21.436 seconds.

A major highlight of the weekend was the last event on Saturday's programme, the team Shootout for the QLD - NSW Noel Simpson Memorial Shield. Each competitor completed one flying timed lap with the times added together with the fastest team being declared the winner. The teams members were on the pace from the word go, but it was the New South Wales team of David Wedd, Steve Roos, Greg Slade, Graeme Hardaker and Ceejay Hillier's day of glory with a combined time of 268.181 seconds to win from the Queensland team of Craig Manteufel, Chantel Holborn, Neil Esplin, Paul Buccini and Jeff Johnson with a combined time of 269.499. New South Wales last won the shield in 2017. With the Morgan Park win they go one up in the 2021 competition.
