The Rotary Club of Toowoomba North runs the 'David Hack Classic' featuring Classic cars and Warbirds, held annually as a fundraiser for local charities such as the Leukaemia Foundation, Blue Care and many more.

David Hack was a young man whose life was tragically cut short by Non Hodgkins Lymphoma (Leukaemia). The loves of his life were cars and photography. He was a motoring photo-journalist, contributing to magazines such as Street Machines, Fast Fours, Wheels, and Performance Street Car Magazine.

For his 28th Birthday, a huge "Birthday Bash" had been organised at Aerotec Hangar, Toowoomba Aerodrome, but tragically he passed away two days before it was held. Rotary has held this annual event to create a lasting memorial to an impressive young man. This year there were over 300 exhibits, some of the attractions on display this year were an Amphicar, the RAAF C27-J Spartan aircraft and many more classic cars, trucks, military vehicles and motorcycles, and warbirds.

Qld Fire & Rescue demonstrated the "jaws of life" and cut up a vehicle in a simulated extraction.

# DARLING DOWNS DIRT TRACK REUNION DINNER

The Darling Downs Dirt Track Reunion Dinner was well organised with over 150 people in attendance. Everyone was given a name tag prior to the night and told to wear them as people had changed shape and developed wrinkles, even the hair colours had changed.

The night was well planned and well organised. There were photos and newspaper clippings of by-gone days on display, and more photos being shown by a slideshow all evening.

There were many donated prizes which were drawn during the evening. I think nearly everyone went home with a prize.

Amongst the attendees were life members Lindsay Simmons (our present Clerk of Course), Graeme Kelly and Dan O'Mara. On Sunday Ron Hoffman had organised a Show and Shine which attracted 40 cars. Everyone agreed the weekend was a marvellous success and enjoyed by all.

Dirt track events started by the Toowoomba Auto Club at Echo Valley, Toowoomba in 1967, followed by the Warwick District Sporting Car Club at Morgan Park, Warwick in 1968, than the Stanthorpe and District Sporting Car Club at Carnell Raceway, Stanthorpe and the Reserve Raceway, Millmerran by the Millmerran Auto Club.

Short Circuit events went along in those early years, with few rules in general, no organised dates for

events, and so the 4 clubs met and agreed that short circuit required a governing body. Hence the Interclub Control Committee was formed in 1977 as the governing body for short circuit events. We were the CAMS of short circuit events. The committee consisted of an independent President, Secretary and Treasurer and three delegates from each of the four clubs two with voting powers.

The function of the I.C.C.C. was to govern the sport, write the rules and regulations, obtain insurance for the events and to supply stewards for the events.

The first few years were very hectic with new rules and regulations, many regulations into car and driver safety but when the dust settled many agreed that these new rules were what was required.

Everything went along fine until 1998 when the ICCC was finding it impossible to obtain insurance so it was decided to approach the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport (CAMS) with the view of affiliating with CAMS. Thanks to all the help from Milton Brennan, State Manager the late Leigh Vine, State Council Chairman and Barry Nixon-Smith, Chairman of the

Motor Racing Panel. After many meeting between the clubs and representatives of CAMS the ICCC became the Short Circuit Motor Racing Association on 5<sup>th</sup> November 1998, another name change the Association changed its name to what it is today Short Circuit Motor Sport Association. In 1998 the Association applied for affiliation with CAMS and were accepted as members of CAMS.

In those early days the drivers and officials all worked together to get the track prepared over two weekends prior to the meeting.

# DAWES HOLDS ON

#### Extract from AutoAction 1-9 October 1997

Round five of the Queensland Short Circuit Touring Car Series was organised by the Stanthorpe and District Sporting Car Club and held at its Carnell Raceway on September 7.

Warwick's Production driver Michael Dawes pushed his Honda to its limit to maintain his lead in the series. Dawes took out heat two, the final and the 20 lap feature to accrue 30 points, which took his total to 153.

Warwick's Jeff Kay won heat two and the 20-lap feature in class, and finished second in the two other races. He is not six points behind Dawes.

The series will go down to the wire at the sixth and final round at Millmerran on September 28.

Sports Sedan drivers Tim Thorne and Con Ryan, on 131 and 130 points respectively, will be waiting in the wings if either Dawes or Kay slip up.

#### Juniors

Round five produced a new leader, Chris Poole (110 points), from Rebecca Dawes (108) and Brett Wilson (98).

Heat one over 10 laps went to Dawes, ahead of Jason O'Mara and Wilson. Jamie Finch picked up heat two after a long battle with Wilson and Poole, while the 12 lap final went to Poole, with Kris Day second and Dawes third. In the 20-lap feature, Day led from flag to flag, with Poole and Wilson trying every trick to get past. Finch also put in a big effort.

#### Production

Heat one over 10 laps saw Wayne Quinlan lead from start to the chequered flag. Michael Dawes ran a close second, with Michael Simpson third. Heat two was won by Dawes after a dice with Quinlan, who finished second. Des Parkinson battled with Simpson until midrace when Simpson got through to take thirds. Both the 12-lap final and 20-lap feature was won by Dawes from Quinlan and Parkinson.

Dawes finished with 153 points, Quinlan 115 points, and Simpson 88 points.

#### **Improved Production**

Heat one over 10 laps turned into a battle between Bill Campbell, Jeff Kay and Jason Coram. Campbell took the heat from Kay with Coram third. Heat two was led away by Graeme Bender before Kay took over the lead on lap two. Coram passed Bender for second on lap seven. Campbell, who had been held up in traffic, got through to third on lap seven and held the spot to the flag. Kay won the heat, with Coram second.

The 12-lap final became a dogfight between Campbell and Kay, with Coram and Mark Edwards in pursuit. Campbell eventually won, with Kay second and Coram third.

Tony Locke led the 20-lap feature, with Edwards, Coram, Teresa Campbell, Bender, Kay and the rest nose-to-tail. Edwards was having his first race on the bitumen and Kay passed him on lap 15, going on to win from Edwards and Coram.

Kay finished with 147 points, Campbell 95 points, and Coram 90 points.

#### Formula Six

Heat one over 10 laps saw Robbie Aspinall lead off with Bruce Bunch and Rex Creer in hot pursuit . Bunch got to the lead on lap five and Glen Krause moved to second, with Aspinall holding onto third. Krause took the heat from Bunch with Creer. Heat two was a battle between Troy Hillier, Krause and Robert Trapp. Hillier won from Krause and Trapp.

The 12-lap final went to Krause from Bunch and Trapp, while the 20-lap feature was won by Hillier from Krause and Bunch.

Scott Bready finish with 122 points, Creer 80 points, and Krause 62 points.

#### Sports Sedans

Heat one over 10 laps was led from start to finish by Scott Higgs. Bruce Mitchell picked up second while Con Ryan finished in third after a battle through traffic. In heat two Nicholas Poole lead to the halfway mark, despite Mitchell, Higgs and Ryan throwing everything at him. On lap five, however, Poole went off, leaving Mitchell to go on and win from Higgs and Rayan.

The 12-lap final was won by Mitchell from Ryan and Poole, while the 20-lap feature saw Bob Power get his act together to win from Ryan and Mitchell.

Ryan finished with 130 points, Mitchell 113 points, and Poole 110 points.

#### Super Sports Sedans

The Super Sport Sedan class was dominated by Toowoomba's Brett Curran in his Chev-powered Ford Capri. Curran won the first two 10-lap heats, with Robert Poole taking second and Tim Thorne third.

The 12-lap final was won by Curran from Thorne and Poole, while in a the 20-lap feature Thorne won from Scott Wood and Gavin Dawes taking third.

Thorne finished with 131 points, Simons Thompson 91 points, Dawes 82 points.

#### Formula Karts

Cameron Johnson won every race from Michael Carney. Ian Mackie finished third in the two heats and the final, and Barry Green finished thirds in the feature.

Johnson finished with 155 points, Green 111 points, Mackie 88 points.
