## The Promise (Prophecies Fortold)

### Preparing Our Hearts for Easter at Harvest View Church

#### *Four Weeks Until Easter*

As we begin this four week journey toward Easter Sunday, we start not at the empty tomb, but in the pages of the Old Testament. The resurrection was not a divine Plan B. It was God's redemptive purpose declared centuries before Bethlehem.

#### **This week, we focus on The Promise.**

The most direct prophecy comes from King David in Psalm 16:10: "For You will not abandon my soul to Sheol, nor will You let your Holy One see decay." On the day of Pentecost, the Apostle Peter quoted this verse as proof that God raised Jesus from the dead (Acts 2:25-32).

The prophet Isaiah also foresaw this victory. Isaiah 53:10-11 declares that after the Servant's suffering, "He will see His offspring, He will prolong His days... He shall see the light of life and be satisfied." The One who dies lives again.

Jesus himself pointed to Jonah, who spent three days in the fish, as the sign of His own burial and resurrection (Matthew 12:40).

#### *Why This Matters*

At Harvest View, we believe God's Word is trustworthy. The resurrection was planned from the beginning. God always keeps His promises.

#### **This Week at Harvest View**

Consider who in your life needs to hear the hope of Jesus. A neighbor, a coworker, A friend who has been walking through a hard season. Someone who has been curious but has never stepped through the doors of a church. This week, invite them to join you at Harvest View for our weekly Sunday Service.

#### **This Week's Prayer**

Lord, thank You for Your faithful promises. As I prepare my heart for Easter, deepen my trust in Your Word. Open my eyes to see how You are weaving redemption in my life. Amen.

#### **This Week's Practice**

Read one prophecy each day: Psalm 16, Isaiah 53, Jonah 1-2, and Genesis 37-50 (Joseph's story).  
Journal what you learn.
