LAST CHORD

LONNIE GASPERINI 1953 - 2024

Our friend and fellow R&B musician Lonnie Gasperini passed in June 2024 after a long illness. Lonnie was born into a musical family and started out on the accordion at age 6, greatly influenced by his uncle Tulio, master on accordion and well known internationally. His mother's brother played drums and also influenced his early



interest in music. In the mid-sixties while still playing accordion he also took up drums while dabbling on a Farfisa organ, Fender Rhodes and piano. He used these skills to later record an Album entitled "Joint Effort " with the group "Cannabis" which toured in the late 60's throughout Texas.

In the early 70's Lonnie started playing more Gospel, Blues, R&B and Jazz with various bands and the Hammond B3 organ was his main instrument. He formed his own band *The What's Up* band which consisted of tenor sax, B3 organ and drums. Later he hired baritone sax man *Art Hazard* and added vocalist, Lavern Sims. This band continued to play for 15 years until Lonnie reinvented his band, *The Lonnie Gasperini Organ Trio* with guitarist, organ and drums. This Trio played throughout New England and NYC and occasionally toured in Florida, California and Chicago featuring different guitar players and drummers. Part of his history includes opening for or performing with Artists such as Lou Rawls, Joe Lee Wilson, Percy Sledge, Dr. Lonnie Smith, George Benson, Melvin Sparks, Al Street, Seleno Clarke, Nate Lucas, Wynton Marsalis, Diane Reeves, Max Lucas, Semenya McCord, Arnie Cheatham, Art Hazard, Willie Love, and many others.

An early supporter of RIRBPS, Lonnie is remembered as a RI based soulful jazz organist. He was instrumental in helping create the Instruments for Children's Program of RIRBPS, distributing instruments to children who may not be able to play without support from our organization. He taught young artists the techniques to be successful music and shared his love of everything music. He will be missed.

LYNN PEGG 1923 - 2024



With heavy hearts we mourn the recent passing of our honorary Board member and friend, Lynn Pegg. Lynn, passed on October 17, 2024, at the age of 102. A cherished member of the Providence community, Lynn was an avid enthusiast of music and songwriting. He was a cofounder and advisory board member of the Rhode Island Rhythm and Blues Preservation Society, remaining an active member until his passing. He was an unforgettable Rhode Island legend, who lived through the historic journey of the iconic blues to the rhythm & blues era. He was more than an avid admirer of blues and R&B music. He was a dedicated songwriter and singer that was especially drawn to the tune "I Got the Blues All Night and Day" that he wrote in the early 1950s.

In keeping with his strong musical and many other demanding family, social and civic interests, Lynn found the time to become a co-founder and advisory board member of the Rhode Island Rhythm and Blues Preservation Society created in 2003. He remained an active member until his passing. His presence, support and dedication will be missed.
