lived life. My memory is a little fuzzy, but I think we met in church. My mother and his mother were both significant people in the local church community. Therefore, we both had to be good boys, and we both

knew it. Both of our mothers were well-loved, admired, and wellrespected. They were icons of dignity and selflessness. Anyway, that's a long way of saying that we were raised right, and we made sure not to get on the nerves of either Sister Padgett or Sister Kurtz.

Dell credits my brother Anderson and I for getting him started in photography during the late 60s. We produced Rhode Island's first black Arts Festivals during that time. Dell said I approached him with the idea of using his photography to help us. I gave him a stipend and a star was born. I don't remember that, but I'm sure glad I did. Dell served the community with his camera and darkroom for decades, and any part I played in that, I'm truly honored.

Dell also served on the Board of the Rhode Island Rhythm and Blues Preservation Society. He likes to remind me that he's the one that suggested we share our program with the public libraries. He loved that the program is a real success. He served us until his health said otherwise, and we are among the first to miss him.

Dell brought his credentials with him to our board. As a member of the 1950s doo-wop group, the Castaleers, he was inducted into the Rhode Island Music Hall of Fame in 2014.

Yep, he's one of the people who started it all, and he shared it all with us. We are truly grateful.



## TRIBUTE TO ARTHUR HAZARD 1942 - 2024



Our friend and fellow R&B musician Arthur Hazard lost his battle after a long illness. Art began his musical career at the age of 12 and was a long-time member of Little Randy and the Stompers. He began in Junior High School and continued throughout the Rhode Island R&B era travelling throughout the northeast and Canada with fellow classmate, Randy Ashe. The sax duo (Art on alto and Randy on Tenor) was like brothers on the road.

After Art moved to New Mexico, an amazing musician for over 65 years,

he played the baritone saxophone until he went on hospice at home last year. Arthur loved playing his horn "Aggie" and could be seen at the Range Cafe in Bernalillo playing in their house band "The DeRangers" every Thursday night. He played his big baritone sax with some of his closest friends and bandmates for the last 10 years. He will be dearly missed by all who know him.

## TRIBUTE TO DELL PADGETT 1936 - 2024



With heavy hearts we mourn the recent passing of our honorary Board member, friend and entertainer, Dell Padgett. Dell recently lost his battle with major medical challenges. A cherished member of the Providence community, Dell will be remembered for his many talents. An accomplished artist and an original member of the 1950s Doo Wop Group, the *Castaleers*, his death has left a deep void in the hearts of those who knew him.

By 1950 Rhythm & Blues was embedded in the Rhode Island black community and the seeds for the development of local talent were sowed. Street corner music became common place. Dell began his musical career in 1952, when the late Richard Jones (lead singer), late Ronald Henries, Herman Bergerson, Bennie Barrows and Del Padgett

formed a vocal group called "The Parakeets". These 5 talented friends, with their sights set on the big time, toured around the state until 1955 when the group re-emerged as "The Castaleers".

The new group consisted of lead singer Richard Jones, the late Ronald Henries, Herman Bergerson, Del Padgett and the late George Smith. The group continued to tour the state with their 1<sup>st</sup> big break coming in 1958. The Castaleers went to Allegro Studios, a subsidiary of London Records, in Boston, Massachusetts where they made their first 45 RPM recording.

In 1958 Richard Jones left the Castaleers and was replaced by the late Joe Hill. Joe hill penned and recorded "My Baby's Alright" and "I Cried". "I Cried" became the groups' biggest hit. George Smith penned the recording, "Bull Fighting Baby". Richard Jones, who had a girlfriend that married someone else when he went into the military, penned and recorded "Lonely Boy". Altogether, the Castaleers recorded "About 10 records". Their last recording, "I Cried" was recorded in 1959.

In 1960, Del Padgett, a former gospel singer, left the group and the Castaleers subsequently broke up for good. He became an accomplished photographer.

*Note:* A special thanks to Del Padgett for providing details of his historical musical career and opening the window to the 'heart and soul' of the Castaleers.

### GOOD NEWS: THE RHODE ISLAND HB #7113 THAT DESIGNATES RHYTHM & BLUES AS THE OFFICIAL STATE MUSIC IS NOW ON THE FLOOR OF THE SENATE.

In January 2024 legislation was filed in the RI Legislature to designate R&B as the 'official music' of Rhode Island. Our founder, Ed 'Prof' Coates has been lobbying the legislature for some time and these efforts are now in the forefront as reported in previous editions of **R&B News of Note.** The legislation was passed by the House of Representatives during this legislative session and is now in the Senate for consideration.

The Bill **ENTITLED**, AN ACT RELATING TO STATE AFFAIRS AND GOVERNMENT -- STATE EMBLEMS (Designates as the state music, the genre of rhythm and blues which contains elements of pop, soul, funk, hip-hop, and electronic

music.) was filed in the **2024 session under H 7113.** The primary sponsor is Representative David A. Bennett RN.

"According to the most recent gossip on 6/12/2024, HB#7113 introduced by the honorable David A. Bennett and honorable co-sponsors McNamara, Hull, Edwards, Slater, Diaz, Corvese, Potter, Carson, Henries and Baginski on 1/10/2024 to designate Rhythm & Blues as the official State music, <u>has passed</u> <u>the House and is now on the floor of the Senate</u> where it is being considered on the merits of its respected value as a worthy cultural symbol like the culturally symbolic Italian deep fried squid; especially after a well-received and highly informative presentation in the House by RI Rhythm & Blues Preservation Society by President Cleveland Kurtz who is now ready and available to do the same for members of the Senate committed to DEI and perhaps those on the fence" states Coates.

When RIRBPS receives further information about the next committee assignment and timeline, we will again ask for your support to: Testify (hopefully in person), sign a petition (copy included in this edition) or Submit a Letter of Support. The effort to persuade the legislature to designate Rhythm & Blues as RI's official state music was picked up by Providence PBS Station, Channel 36 reporters and will be highlighted on Providence PBS station channel 36, last year (July 9 and Re-Broadcast on July 12, 2023). The Program was broadcast as part of the Rhode Island PBS weekly series.



### A DAY in the LIFE

'A Day in the Life' series will continue in 2024 after a very successful summer season last year. The R&B Preservation Hall Band, led by Music Director, Max Whiting performed at four Providence Libraries in the 2023 summer/fall season. The series mixes music with dialogue to introduce RIRBPS to new audiences while highlighting the music of R&B to the life of an R&B musician in Rhode Island.
