




Oncept.

Other Cast Members

SLOAN CHAPMAN

The younger sister to the male lead Zach Chapman- she goes to law school and is only helping in the travel show to help out her family member. In the room of cast members she's typically the most level headed and intelligent-however because of this she is the most disinterested in the show itself and sees how dumb the whole thing really is.

NOLE BALANOWITZ

The last of Chapman's high school friends, Nole was brought on to the show to bring some levity and some insight into conspiracy theories. He's studied them thoroughly but this has led to him being a little bit different since high school.

SCHMITTY

The final original on camera cast member casted to the travel show not only because he's college friends with the host Zach Chapman, but because his journalism major at a party school was seen as helpful. It becomes clear early on that journalism was just something Schmitty picked at random just to have an excuse to go party at college. While he has a heart of gold deep down, he is pretty much your exaggerated frat boy at first glance.

Crew Members

ANDRE BROWN & REECE GEMSTONE
The craigslist hires, Andre and
Reece are the crew that Zach
must rely on for the technical
aspects of his show. Andre,
the boom op and sound guy, is
simply here to lazily earn a
quick buck and is indifferent
to filmmaking. The cameraman,
Reece, is a passionate artist
who has jumped on this chance
to be a part of a potential
show. His extreme knowledge
of cinema is limited by the
miniscule budget Zach has given him.



GEMMA

The optimistic intern, Gemma is one of the most important crew members, as she is the only PA on set. Since she's the youngest person there, she is easily the most hungry and eager person. Gemma sees Chapman as a visionary and feeds into his ego very heavily. Her naivety while her most endearing quality is also what tends to get her into trouble. As she grows throughout the show by the end she'll be better and more successful than anyone else here.

CASPIAN

The pretentious head writer. Why does a travel show need a head writer? Zach Chapman asks the same question as Caspian is typically the blunt of his criticisms with the show. Caspian is a simple person Chapman can blame when things go wrong even though none of it is ever his fault. Most of the comedy from this character comes from his unaware pretentiousness; he thinks way too deeply about a simple travel show.

Antagonists

MR. ESPOSITO

An ex-financier of the show- Mr Esposito is the definition of guido. He typically wears a nice blazer over a wife beater with the biggest cigar ever seen. Since he cut funding to the show, for reasons he nor Chapman are legally allowed to talk about (word on the street is Esposito lost it and punched Chapman in the face), he has gone on to produce the show's main competition- 'Across the Globe'.

'ACROSS THE GLOBE'

A rival travel show consisting of strong female leads and instead of focusing on hunts and investigations it focuses on humanitarian efforts around third world countries. Chapman calls bull and thinks they're doing it just to look good for TV, but he is the asshole for getting mad. Oh your crew spent last week hunting treasure in Honduras? Well 'Across the Globe' was there too to feed an entire orphanage.



Minisodes

For ideas that don't need a whole episode or every character, we have created "minisodes". Minisodes are small simple adventures that could be an extra source of entertainment and advertising. They could be on Youtube, Snapchat, or even the dreaded Tik Tok.

Minisode Examples :

The Crew vs. Holes: our cast knows a treasure lies somewhere in a field, watch them struggle and collapse into chaos as they each race to see who can find it first.

The Crew vs. Germany: as a proud German and with the rising success of ATW, Schmitty gets asked to give a speech at an Oktoberfest in his hometown. As part of his culture, Schmitty gets trashed on beer and the rest of the crew has to desperately search the festival and find him before his speech.

Andre vs. Society: Everything the Craigslist hired crewmember does in a day for Zach Chapman. This includes him getting in a fight with a man at his local dry cleaner as he's picking up explorer costumes for a coming episode.

The Crew vs. Guido Producer: Zach, Sloan and Andre get invited by their financier to a horse race. They fear it's to cut funding so they go to an extraordinary length to make sure that doesn't happen.

The Crew vs. Research: They finally have the money to produce a full length pilot- no more minisodes! This is the most chaotic episode as it has our cast and crew devolve into utter madness as they all have completely different ideas for what the pilot can and should be. Ends with them going with none of the ideas pitched and stealing the 'Mothman' idea from a random passerby.



We have initinally outlined a ten episode arc, however this series has the potential to build on this arc and create a story that occupies multiple seasons. The ten episode arc ends with their reality show being greenlit, and future seasons will deal with how the industry changes people to their core.

The episode potential for this series is only limited by the amount of adventures that this planet has to offer, which, as of right now, is quite a lot.
