“The Hands of Zerubbabel, a Prophecy Fulfilled” Part I

Every word spoken by God; shall be fulfilled. No power or force under the heaven can contain, restrain, change, or prevent the word of God from taking and reaching its desired course. 4. Speaking further on the transfer of spirits, what spirit will God send before the great and dreadful day? Malachi 4:5-6
5. As we view the spirit of Zerubbabel, in its transference to the Prophet Webb, what teaching did we receive from him that is seen as our official authorization to the kingdom of God? Revelation 12:17
6. Further speaking of the works of Zerubbabel, what statement is made letting us know that God will use this spirit in this, our time? Acts 15:16
7. As we compare Acts 15:14-16, to Zechariah 4:9, what conclusion do we come to regarding both the rebuilding of Israel and the role that the prophet plays? Zechariah 4:9
8. The Prophet Webb accepted the assignment to rebuild the Tabernacle of David. Why did he involve other members of the church, by appointing them to duties which were as building blocks? Romans 12:4-5

“The Hands of Zerubbabel, a Prophecy Fulfilled” Part II

The preaching of the everlasting gospel would take place after the time of the Gentiles. In Gary, Indiana, the spirit of the Lord fell upon a lowly, uneducated man. This man, uneducated, and unlikely to ever be noticed by the world, was God’s choice; from among men. Thus, the angel did receive the word from Christ, and delivered it to God’s chosen messenger, James T. Webb. By visions and dreams was this all important work delivered, and carried out. Many booklets were written under the watchful eye and guidance of his appointed angel. He was commanded to send them throughout the world, to all of the main religious institutions and governments; proclaiming the impending hour of God’s judgment. The prophet was not disobedient to the calling and finished his work of judgment in the late nineteen fifties. As the prophet awaited his promised rest of God, God again alerted him to another event, the ending of the Gospel Dispensation. As a result of this finding, he was given the task of rebuilding the Tabernacle of David, which had been in ruins since the Roman army had entered Jerusalem and destroyed it, over two thousand years ago. (Luke 21:24) For many centuries those who understood the prophecies, watched to see when the Jews would return to Zion. James T. Webb was a man who feared God and gave glory to him, in all things. He recognized the Almighty Wisdom of God, as the Mother of all creation, and worshipped the very mention of her name. He acknowledged Jesus Christ, as the creator, and Savior. He embraced the holy testimonies of Jesus, and forever proclaimed them to be the doctrine of God. The Lord poured his spirit to awaken Israel, whom was asleep in a strange land, as foretold by the prophets. This spirit searched the hedges and highways and many were called. From this group, God chose a people that would rebuild the Tabernacle of David. God put the spirit of questioning among them, and it was these questions that led to mass communication among the seed of Israel, as to their true identity. It was through this channel of communication, that God introduced the people from the hedges and highways to James T. Webb.
