This class makes reference to a war that is **unknown** to mankind, which means that there is in fact a war that mankind is very sure that he knows about; this **known** war to mankind is called, “The War of Armageddon”. Man has known about this war since he could read the Bible. However, before we go into details of these two wars – the **unknown** and the **known** – we will first look at a remarkable, geographical landscape that describes, as was written by Bro. James T. Webb, a “Tale of Two Cities: Mt. Zion, the City of David (or **Beulah Land**) and **New Jerusalem**. Both these cities were named in the Old Testament in the time of David; yet, the new fashioned cities to come with these same names are made for us by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. After looking at the two cities, we will explore the two wars and the importance of them in reference to the two cities.

PART II – JERUSALEM: OLD AND NEW

As known, the city that is the capital seat of the Land of Israel is called Jerusalem. This city was around going back to our forefathers and is the heart of conflict amongst the nations even today. However, we know also that this city is most beloved by our Lord and shall be made again...new...but shall not be seen in this present earth; it is placed in the new heaven and new earth. New Jerusalem's architecture will be far different from the City of Zion, known as the City of David and changed to bear the names of Hephzibah and Beulah Land. [Note: Each foundation shall have its own sky, with the presence of our Lord illuminating the whole thereof; therefore, there will be no sun or moon. Upon entering your own specific gate with your name attached to it such as Issachar or Zebulon, while entering in side by side, upon entrance you shall be on your own designated floor – automatically. This is because of the city’s design; it will be that dimensional!]

PART III – THE TWO WARS:

- 1) **THE IMPENDING UNKNOWN WAR OF JERUSALEM**
- 2) **THE WAR OF ARMAGEDDON**

We begin with the Prophet Webb's account on the pending war:

There shall be a great war between the nations of the Middle East, anciently known as the “Land of Canaan” or “Palestine” and today as the “Holy Land”, which is now occupied by the nations of the Near-East this day. It is the land that is between the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea and the Caspian Sea, and all of Iran and Arabian Sea. This land is tagged and is called the “Land of God” or the “Holy Mountains of God” in the earth (Exodus 3:1, Isaiah 27:13 and Zechariah 8:3). There are many scriptures in the Bible where the Lord has placed his name upon these mountains. Further speaking in Bible history, the Lord has visited these mountains of his name in many ways and has dedicated them to his saints.

First, the Lord sent Abraham into these lands and they became the land of Israel behind the exodus and further speaking, these lands were occupied by the Canaanites until they were driven from them, later known as Palestine. Today it is called the Middle East and is occupied by nations of this day whom appear on the maps. The history of this land is dripping with blood and tears. Here history has painted a gruesome history of wars and suffering of man: both righteousness and wickedness was displayed here. In this land where God has made holy, the Devil was sure to set up a beachhead and turn these lands into utter wickedness and idolatry. Now as we look at today's maps and the nations of today that occupies lands between the four seas, today by these nations, the land is dripping with blood. Still, wars, clashes and violence, unrest, earthquakes and famine-suffering of all kinds is the news of today.

This day the Middle East is seething in wrath, bloodshed and violence over the land, which is not theirs: wars and rumors of wars and threats. Now no ending wrath has prepared them with enough energy for self destruction; and under wrath they shall be called to Jerusalem to fight an unknown war...if you can call it a war. That is what the nations shall think as they are drawn toward Jerusalem. Yet, Jerusalem shall fall by them! Then God shall set every man against his fellow whom stands beside him and there shall be self destruction on all sides. God shall call them against Jerusalem and they shall declare war.

God shall do the fighting in the behalf of his people Israel. This is a war of God against the nations of the Middle East. Israel, as you know, is scattered among all nations of the earth and their land is under these nations; and the time is come when God shall deliver Israel back to their place. He shall himself destroy all these nations out of the land and Israel shall have it again.

The Impending Unknown War of Jerusalem

The Battle of Armageddon

Now in this section we will see that this battle is not between nations – like the war in the Middle East – but this war shall be strictly between **ALL** nations, peoples and tongues left on the earth against **GOD ALMIGHTY!** Can you imagine that? You probably really can't because it seems very foolish for a man to actually think he can beat God, right?!

Before we start, let us look at the scriptures to see how they explain this point.

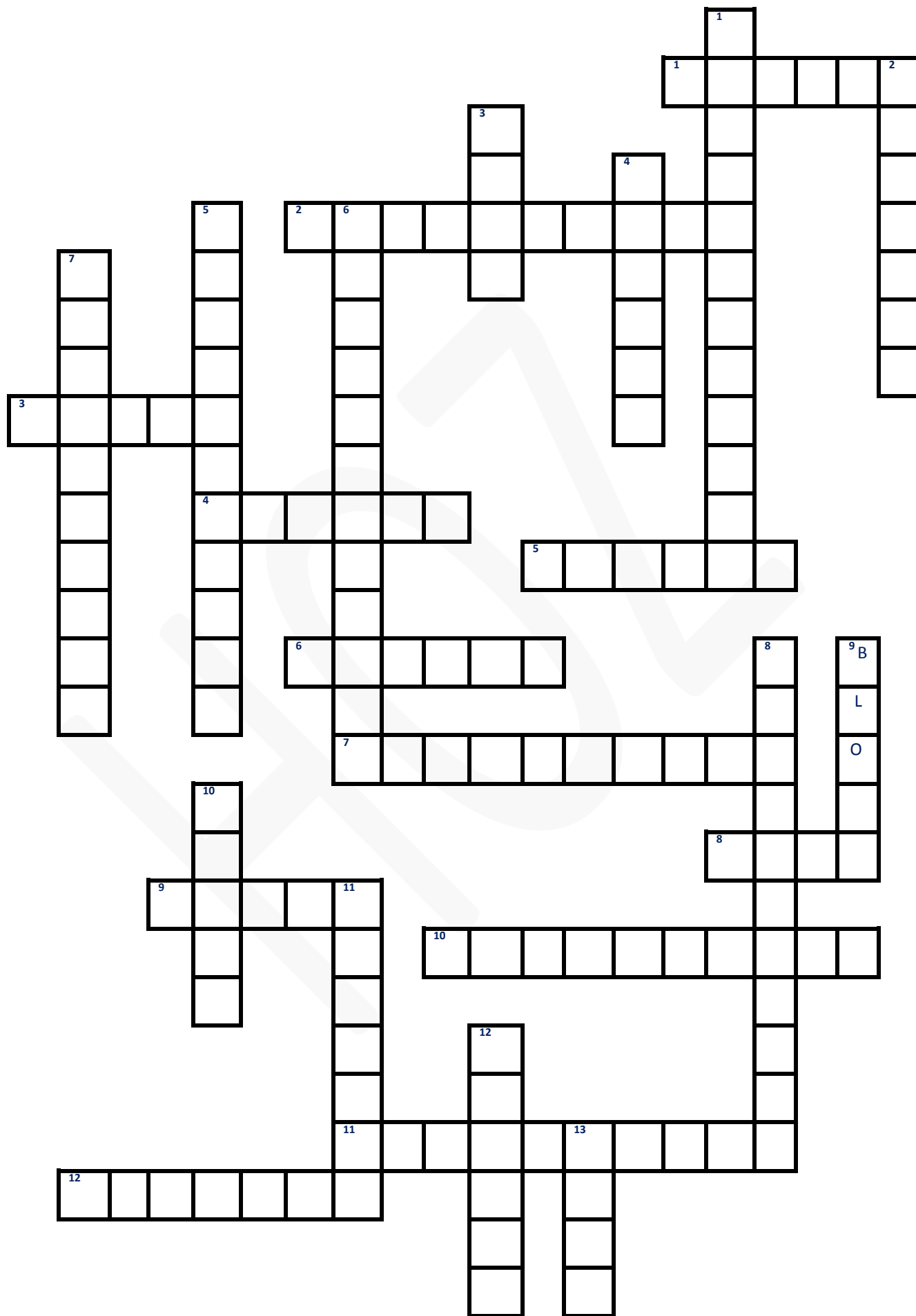
