FINANCIAL REPORT:

- -- 2025 Budget Review
 - Tom presented a Reserve Forecast Project sheet, comparing 2017 to 2025 budget items.
 - Total projected cost in 2025 is \$648k vs Total Reserved of \$437,500; giving us a shortfall of \$209,500
 - Our biggest shortfalls come from Asphalt-Overlay and Asphalt-Sealcoat. Our reserved funds allocated for this project do not cover projected 2025 cost.
 - We need to look at Mailboxes (\$9k) and Pond cleaning (\$5k) budget items and reassess cost for each.

- Total Reserve forecast budgeted at \$647K, which is a 10.36% increase from 2017.
- Allocated \$30k/year into the Reserve Fund
- HOA's largest expense is landscape.
 - o Tom Proposes Pacific Landscape to compartmentalize and breakdown work
 - O Question: Is Pacific Landscape offering a bundled service? For example, when they are doing work for Staats Lake, are they doing work for both SLA & ISHOA?
 - o We may seek other bids to see if other companies can offer better pricing and service.
 - o Tree trim update: We are caught up going forward. We had still been dealing with the aftermath of the ice storm from a couple of years ago.
 - o Bark- We have \$15k reserved for this project in our Capital Reserves. Can this be budgeted into Landscape?
- We need to cut expenses to offset a future increase in dues. To do so we will cut back on office supplies and cut our budget for the Annual Homeowners Meeting food budget (25% reduction)
- Our Reserve Target of \$450k would be more manageable to achieve.
- CDs: WVB (\$275k) & Umpqua (\$134k)

 - Busy with Trees, and irrigation projects. Overall, it was an expensive year for the Landscape Committee
 - The committee feels the HOA is receiving better service from Pacific Landscape.
- -- Report from the Staats Lake Association (SLA)
 - Geese- 119 dead birds; spent approx.. \$4000 in geese removal
 - It is ok to put dead geese on the lake bank for wildlife removal to take care of.
 Dead birds are tagged.
 - Sinkhole by condos: The condo association is still seeking help from neighboring HOAs to help pay for repair.
 - SLA now has a Full board- 2 members from ISHOA; and 2 ELA (Brian Williams; Matt Holstege)
 - Went over cost breakdown/recap on expenses
- -- Report from Webmaster
 - Future email route: emails going to 2 committee members instead of just 1.

OTHER BUSINESS:

-- Condo sinkhole funding request
