#### KENT NEWS DEC. 1874 150 YEARS AGO

HE CORNER-STONE of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Galena, in this county, will be laid (God willing) on THURS-DAY, the 31st of December, the last day of this Several of the clergy are expected to be nt and assist in the services. The Bishop present and assist in the services. The Bishop of the Diocese we hope to have with us, and deliver the address. To the congregation, so deeply in earnest in this work, this will be an exceedingly interesting occasion. We sincerely trust that many may be there to "rejoice with those that do rejoice" and "weep with those that" are almost ready to "weep" for very joy at the prospect of seeing the Church so dear to their bearts at last about to be put upon a secure basis in this place.

Should the weather prove unfavorable for service out of doors the work on the building is being pushed rapidly so that all may expect to be comfortable. Service begins at 10½ A. M. Dec. 12, 1874—3t.


#### KENT NEWS NOV. 1889 100 YEARS AGO
