

Mrs. James Scotten, Miss Selma and Master Richard Scotten and John Boyd went in an automobile to Baltimore on Saturday.


Elmer Jarman was at Lambson Station during the severe storm of Wednesday afternoon when a large limb blew from a tree and crushed the top of his automobile.

ZONING ORDINANCE

CHAPTER 123. PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS

Hours of operation: from sunrise to sunset daily. Nothing good happens

after midnight anyways. <u>NO DOGS ALLOWED IN THE PARK</u>. If you'd like to walk with your dog,

Gateway Park down the street is dog friendly. Anyone who walks their dog(s) in the park area must have them on a leash and under their control at all times, and they will be responsible for picking up and disposing of their dog feces in a suitable container outside of the park area, not in your

neighbors trash bin. WE HAVE HAD NUMEROUS COMPLAINTS REGARDING PET OWNERS NOT PICKING UP AFTER THEIR DOG(S).



NO BICYCLES, GO-CARTS, MOTORIZED, OR ANY SIMILAR TYPE

VEHICLES will be allowed in the park. However, bicycles may be in designated bicycle racks or the rack area. (The only other exception to this will be ADA

manual or motorized equipment.) TOWN OF GALENA CORPORATE LIMITS

It shall be unlawful to operate the following enumerated motorized vehicles within the Town limits of Galena, Maryland: minibikes, trikes, go-carts, snow mobiles, and any other vehicles which cannot be licensed for operation on the public highway in the State of Maryland.

The Galena Park, Tree, and Recreation committee has been working with Briscoe Manor and Galena Elementary School to transplant a variety of flowering and food plants from Briscoe to the School property along the walking trail due to the recent decision to remove most of the landscaping at Briscoe and replace it with turf grass. Although the Park and Tree team wishes Briscoe would keep the plants on property, the Briscoe employees have been helpful in the process of relocating the plants to the elementary school. 2023 This Fiscal Year - Galena Projects in Review 2024

"We've been busy working with the students and staff at Galena Elementary School this year."



Resident Kent Cultural Alliance Artist Austen Camille and Council Members Justinian Dispenza and Sarah Merrell helped the students plant two maple trees at the school for Arbor Day and led the students on an insect scavenger hunt!



Council Member Dispenza has also been visiting the school weekly to lead the inschool composting program. Students in 2nd through 5th grade compost daily during their lunch time and the program has already diverted 4 pallets of food waste from the landfill. We are in the second year of the program and the students are excited to continue the program. Residents are welcome to deposit fruit and veggie scraps into the compost bins (located behind the school on the right side) after 4:30p.m., but not during regular school hours.

The Town of Galena continues to work on an Emergency Plan in the event of a catastrophic event in our town. Warren Walters, Maintenance Coordinator, has been participating in the Maryland's EMOD meetings. One take away from these meetings is identifying those in our community that have special needs, either functional or accessibility. An online form can be found on our website (https://townofgalena.com/forms) to share this information with the town. We will not share this personal information with anyone unless there is the need during an emergency, but it will help emergency personnel meet the needs of our residents.

In conjunction with this project, several other things have been happening. The Town of Galena, in conjunction with the St. Dennis Catholic Church, has applied for a grant through M.D.E. The Red Cross has surveyed the Galena Elementary School as well as the Sunday School building at St. Dennis. They stated that both facilities will work well for a temporary housing location. They have also offered to train the volunteers that graciously committed to help in the event of an emergency.

Through this process, we are trying to prepare for what may happen in today's world, but also Emergency Plan to see how Kent County, the Town of Galena, and it's volunteers may be able to assist the public we serve.

Galena Grants

FY24 Grant Review


During this fiscal year, the Town of Galena applied for \$386,540 plus technical assistance and chemical costs for the town WWTP. Of those applications, \$381,540 (98%) was awarded. Due to soil issues at the Division Street Project, we withdrew from that grant, leaving \$68,408, including our match that was approved. Total income from grant applications during FY24 is \$55,500.

Additional Community Park Equipment

We received notification that our Teen Play Area was included in the State of Maryland's FY2025 Budget in the amount of \$44,835. These funds must be approved by the Maryland Board of Public Works, and we will be notified of their decision. This grant was for the Parallax climbing equipment and installation. Total funds requested were \$51,875, so we were approved for 86% of the request. Estimated costs with an 11% inflation buffer are \$55,462 so our match would be \$10,627.



Our vendor has resubmitted the 30% design plans with updates to reflect the shared-use path along MD 290 and the stormwater design. The proposed Rectangular Rapid flashing beacons (RRFB crossing for interim approval for SHA has also been resubmitted.
