Invite friends and spread the word! Bring a lawn chair and some shade to watch the boat parade from the levee.



## Safety Officer's Report

Spring Checkup by Lu Abel

It's spring and it's time to go sailing! Well, yes. But maybe also a time to do a springtime check up on our boat. Close and reopen each one of your boat's seacocks to ensure each can be opened and closed properly. One of the most important seacocks is the one that admits raw seawater into your engine's cooling system. These days most engine cooling systems then pump the raw seawater through a heat exchanger with a fresh-water, antifreeze-laden cooling circuit that goes through your actual engine.

A water pump with a rubber, multi-finger impeller drives the seawater through the heat exchanger. The water pump has a plate on it; removing

the screws holding the plate in place will expose the impeller and you can visually check it. If there's any sign of finger wear or fingers broken off, replace the impeller. Oh, and having a spare impeller on board is cheap insurance in case the impeller suddenly disintegrates while you're underway.

While you're at it, check all the engine belts, including the one driving that water pump. Visually inspect them for wear. Check them for proper tensioning not too tight, not too lose. A belt should deflect about 1/2 inch along its longest run. Check your boat's muffler, too. Typically, seawater exits the cooling water heat exchanger and goes into a muffler where engine exhaust is cooled and silenced by the water. That's the water you see surging out of your boat's exhaust fitting in your boat's transom. Since you're crawling around the back end of your boat anyway, check your cockpit drain hoses (the ones that run from a drain fitting in your boat's cockpit to a through hull) for signs of wear or deterioration.

Let's get our heads out of the engine compartment. Check your batteries. If they're the old fashioned type of lead-acid batteries, pull the caps on each battery and check the plates are covered with water. If not, top them off with distilled water. Check the gauge on your fire extinguishers to make sure it's still in the green zone. And make sure they're not beyond their expiration date...10 years from the date of manufacture. While you're checking dates,

check your emergency flares. They expire 42 months from date of manufacture. Check your bilge pumps. The diaphragm in a manual pump can wear out or fail. Check the water level switch on the electric pump to make sure it comes on if there is water in the bilge and make sure the pump actually pumps water and there isn't a blockage in its line somewhere.

Last but not least, if you're at your boat some night, check that all your navigation lights work. Not too much fun to be late returning to your home port and to discover your nav lights don't illuminate!

All these checks should only take an hour or two. Time well spent to ensure that you have a wonderful summer on the water!

### **Naughty Cal Corner**

#### Rights of Way - Power

Vessels at night must show a red light on the port side and a green light on the starboard side. Thus, it is possible to determine if a vessel is approaching or departing from your vantage point.

- More importantly, which light you can see determines who has right of way.
- the right of way vessel is called the "stand-on" vessel; the other is the "give-way" vessel
- with another power boat, going in opposite directions, pass port to port
- vessel ahead is the stand-on; overtaking is the give-way
- in crossing situations, the vessel that has the other to her starboard side shall give way

If you see their red light, give way. If you see their green light, stand-on with caution.
