



# Melvich Community SCIO DECEMBER 2021 UPDATE





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#### 1. INTRODUCTION

Thanks for taking the time to read our updates. We hope that you find these updates useful and informative. A lot has happened in the background since our update to you in October, so we thought it timely to give you another update.

## 2. STRATEGIC PLAN IMPLEMENTATION

We are moving forward with implementing the preferred decision from the Options Assessment of knocking down the existing village hall, acquiring adjacent land and designing/constructing a replacement facility that is fit for purpose and will help meet the needs of our community in the medium to long term.

We are awaiting news on whether we have been successful with our grant funding applications to help us purchase additional land behind the site of the former village hall. We are hoping to know the outcome of these applications soon, then we can progress with the next steps of purchasing the land and transferring the associated title deeds.

We have started the work to define the specifications for the new community hub.





A well-attended Specification Workshop was held at the Halladale Inn on the 6<sup>th</sup> November 2021. A huge thanks to the Halladale Inn for hosting this event for us and providing teas/coffees and biscuits to the participants.

Various questions were posed to the participants and their responses to these questions generated over 500 post-it notes of information. The outputs from this workshop, combined with information received from others in the community and various community groups, has really helped give us a picture of what you want and need to have available in our community.


Thank you to everyone who has inputted to the process so far. We have captured various detailed requirements for specific rooms and for meeting specific needs, but before we start preparing the Detailed Specifications for engaging with designers/architects we need your thoughts too.

Inside the community hub building, the inputs suggest that we should have the following types of rooms:

Please note that we have additional detailed requirements under each of these room headings (e.g. under toilets we have captured the need for male toilets, female toilets, disabled toilets, changing places facility, baby change facility, etc). For the use of the land, the following key things have been indicated:

Are there any significant omissions from the jigsaw piece lists? Are there things that you don't agree with including? Is there anything that you want included that you feel may not be captured by the headings in the jigsaw pieces? Please share your thoughts with us as it is easy to make amendments now, but as the design and build progresses, then it is harder to make changes.

There have been two meetings of the Community Growing Project since our last community update.

Plans are progressing for the temporary use of the vacant land at the site of the former village hall. You should see some changes at the site in the near future. The first visible change is that the volunteers have erected a Christmas Tree with 600 flashing lights.

We hope that this starts to get you into a festive mood. Most of the planting and addition of furniture on the site will happen in 2022 and everything should be in place for public use in the summer. We are delighted to announce that we have received a £500 micro-grant from Melvich Community Council as a contribution to benches/seating that will be installed as part of the Community Growing Project. A big thank you to the community council for this micro-grant award.
