The Committee would like to thank everyone that took part in the survey and those that managed to attended the Open Day.


We received 62 responses to the Public Consultation Questionnaire and 23 people took part in the Open Day.





WOULD BENEFIT FROM HALL BEING AVAILABLE IF ANY POWER CUTS TO ALLOW PEOPLE TO HAVE SOMEWHERE TO GET A HOT DRINK OR MEAL.

COMMUNITY GENERATOR BESIDE BOTTLE BANK FOR WINTER POWER CUTS, FUNDED BY WIND FARM MONEY

HALL NOT FIT AT THE MOMENTS FOR THE ABOVE. HOW ARE YOU GOING TO GET POWER?

VERY RESILIENT WHEN CALLED UPON. HALL NOT FIT IN CURRENT STATE TO BE CENTRAL POINT. REPLACE IT AND MAKE IT FIT FOR PURPOSE THEN IT COULDBE A CENTRAL POINT.

A MODERN FRESH HALL WOULD BE IDEAL FOR A CENTRAL HUB IF SAY THERE IS MORE FIRES OR POWER CUTS. AS IT STANDS NOW IT IS VERY DATED AND HAS BEEN FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS.

SUTHERLAND PEOPLE HAVE BEEN RESILIENT SINCE THE HIGLAND CLEARANCES PUT OUR PEOPLE TO THE COASTAL FRINGES ADN OUT OF THE GLENS. THE WEATHER IS TO BE EMBRACED AND MAJOR EVENTSARE ALWAYS OVERCOME. WE DO ALL LIKE THE FINER THINGS IN LIFE BUT CAN EASILY COPE WITH THE OCCASIONAL POWER CUT OR MAJOR EVENT. IN TEH EVENT OF ROAD CLOSURES DUE TO ACCIDENTS, TRAVELLERS MAY BENEFIT FROM OUR HALL DOORS BEING OPENED UP. BUT NOT AS IT CURRENTLY STANDS - NEED IMPROVEMENT

HAVING PREVIOUSLY EXPERIENCE PROLONGED POWER CUTS IN LATHERONWHEEL, HOT FOOD VANS PROVIDED FOR THE COMMUNITY AND VOLUNTEERS TOOK FOOD TO THOSE THAT WERE HOUSEBOUND. WOULD BE GOOD TO HAVE CATERING FACILITIES.

DEPENDING ON THE INCIDENT I WOULD ANTICIPATE PEOPLE WOULD REACT ACCORDINGLY AND MANAGE THE SITUATION

AS A REMOTE VILLAGE AWAY FROM FACILITIES WE DON'T HAVE ADDEQUATE FACILITIES. HOWEVER, AS A COMMUNITY WE WOULD ALL PULL TOGETHER TO SUPPORT ANY ISSUES FACING US OR OTHERS

THE HALL WHEN REBUILT WOULD MAKE A GOOD CENTRAL POINT IN THE EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY

RECENT FIRES - HALL COULD HAVE BEEN USED AS A HUB FOR VOLUNTEERS
WITH MANY WIND GENERATORS CONNECTED TOT HE ELECTRICAL GRID IT IS LIKELY
THAT COINCIDENT INPUT FAILURES TO THE SYSTEM WILL CAUSE SIGNIFICANT
OUTAGE OF HTE GRID, TAKING MUCH TIME TO RE-INSTATE i.e. MANY DAYS. ARE WE

READY FOR SUCH A FAILURE OF THE GRID?
TOILETS SHOULD HAVE SHOWER FACILITIES

THIS SHOULD BE A COLLABORATION WITH THE COMMUNITY COUNCIL. A MEMBER OF THE MVHA WHO IS ALSO ON THE COMMUNITY COUNCIL COULD BE THE LIAISON BETWEEN THE TWO TO ENSURE THERE IS A "PLAN". PERHAPS COORDINATED WITH THE CARE HOME AND SCHOOL ALSO.

SINCLAIR COURT (MCCU) HAS A GENERATOR AND COULD BE USED AS A HUB
IT COULD SERVE AS A REFUGE IN AN EMERGENCY BUT I DON'T KNOW IF IT IS THE
BEST SPOT.

I THINK INDIVIDUALS, SOME OF THEM ANYWAY, HAVE STRONG RESILIENCE ARRANGEMENTS

I THINK SOME MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY LOOK AFTER EACH OTHER IN THESE SITUATIONS, BUT THERE WILL BE SOME WHO WILL NEED SUPPORT

COMMUNITY NEEDS RESILIENCE PARTICULARLY DUE TO CLIMATE CHANGE AND FREQUENCY OF EXTREME EVENTS

COMMUNITY VIA COMMUNITY COUNCIL PROVIDED SUPPORT DURING WILD FIRES. IF THERE WAS A POWER CUT AND ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS A WELL EQUIPPED HALL WOULD BE CENTRAL TO SUPPORTING THE COMMUNITY

THE VILLAGE NEEDS A PROPER HUB WITH FACILITIES/ACCESS FORN ELDERLY ANAD DISABLED. MINI GP SURGERY WITH STOCK AND EQUIPMENT, PLUS NECESSARY ELECTRICAL SOCKETS TO MANAGE DISABLED EQUIPMENT SUCH AS OXYGEN FOR MULTIPLE PEOPLE. THE HUB WOULD NEED IT'S OWN GENERATOR.








FITNESS CLASSES DAY AND EVENING TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO BECOME MORE ACTIVE AND MORE INTERACTIVE WITHOTHER MEMEBERS OF THE COMMUNITY

OUTCOMES

A total of 235 Questonnaires were distributed throughout the Melvich, Portskerra, Goval, Bighouse and Kirkton area, all in the Parish of Farr. Of those, we had 62 questionnaires returned which is a return rate of 26.38%, which means a quarter of the community engaged.

Very few people actually use the hall on a weekly basis, but most use the hall once or twice a a year. The condition of the hall and type of events put on were the main reason for not using the hall more often. However, if these issues were addressed over 95% of those surveyed would come to the hall more often.

The most popular events attended were:

30 votes - Pop Up cafe
25 votes - the Public Consultation Open Day
22 votes - Private hire events; Meetings; Wakes & Remembrance events and
Christmas events
20 votes - Bingo

Currently the main method of communicating events is via word of mouth, posters in the village and on the Village Hall web site. Twenty people (20) stated they only found out about an event after it had taken place. Looking forward the most popular choices for improved communication were:

32 votes - Posters in Village and at Shop 29 votes - a village newsletter

28 votes - Website (www.melvich.com)

23 votes - Facebook

21 votes - Email

The type of events and services the community would like to see are as follows:

21 votes - WiFi Internet access

21 votes - Other - consisting of lunch clubs for the elderly; indoor markets; live music; indoor games; interesting presentations and a variety of exercise classes during the day and evening.

20 votes - Film club/projection facilities

11 votes - Book club/library

10 votes - Computers and printers

60% of those surveyed do not believe the community has adequate resilience arrangements in place. The condition of the current hall is not up to any major resilience event due to it's deteriorated condition. There are calls for the building to be replaced and made fit for purpose with upgraded communications and facilities.

90% of those surveyed would like to have the village hall as a Central Point of help in an emergency situation.

With regard to improving social welfare and conditions for people in the area there was a consensus that regular coffee mornings were a priority (40 votes) with more day time activities (31) also being important.

There are people in the area with some great skills that could contribute to the improvements needed. There are also residents with specific interests and hobbies that could be encouraged to come and share their knowledge with the community.

There was large support (41 votes and 11 maybe's) for a '100 Club' where residents make a small monthly commitment to the maintenance of the hall.

Awareness of the fact the village hall association was a registered charity was split relatively evenly with No (32 votes) and Yes (24 votes). It is important the association promotes this benefit to the community.

There was large support (55 votes) for the concept of a Monthly Calendar of Events for the village hall and surrounding areas. This could be addressed by use of a Village Newsletter.
