


detective further on in my career path.

Children are at the heart of everything we do. We are clear and resolved in our mission. Today, more of us than ever before understand the need for a Foundation whose main focus is to be committed to helping the precious young people throughout our community.

This year's newsletter highlights our past year which would not have been as successful without **YOU** as partners in our mission. THANK YOU. However, the needs of our students are substantial. We need **YOU** to help us continue with our

important work.

An application for scholarship assistance submitted to us this year struck me deeply when I read the section for Principal comments. One Principal wrote about a family situation that she just discovered, telling us that the family has been eating only rice and eggs for months because that is what they could afford. Yet, despite this family's financial hardships, they were working hard to be able to send two children to their local Catholic elementary school because they knew it would provide their children opportunities they did not have and sought for their children.

Another story surrounds a public school teacher whose husband had died in an unusual situation (we don't want to reveal too much of this instance). Due to these extraordinary circumstances, the family needed much therapy. The Mom's comments to us were that the Catholic school welcomed her with open arms, so much so that the school became a family to this mother and children in need. This widowed Mom said sending her children to Catholic school was "the best decision of her life".

And then there is the single Dad of three who drives a school bus, working two jobs because he desires to send all three of his children to Catholic school. I pictured their everyday schedules in my minds' eye and remain in awe of this family and the many families who sacrifice so much for their children.

Finally, I read comments from the Grandparent who is taking care of her grandchild who now resides with her. The Grandmother had retired and expected her life to go one way when her grandchild's family fell apart. This Grandmother so deeply values a Catholic education that she is now cleaning houses to pay for her grandchild's tuition and expenses at one of our Catholic schools.

There are hundreds of stories like these that come to our office each year and these families are desperately looking for assistance. We simply do not have enough funds to help each of them, and that is why the work of our Distribution Committee can be very heavy at times. However, we are hopeful and optimistic about the hundreds of children we do help each year. Our goal is to grow from year to year as we proceed into the future. Will you help us help these local students?

If you would like to understand our organization at a deeper level, please give me a call. We foster a culture of kindness and respect. Thank you to our Board of Trustees, our staff, our donors, our educators

and related staff who see the meaning behind this work. They see the uniqueness and value of our children, who are our future, and leaders of the world at large.
