Oxana Ossiptchouk was educated in North Ossetiya, Russia, where she received a Master's degree at the Sergey Rachmaninov State Conservatory in Rostov-on-Don in Violin Solo Performance, Orchestral Performance and Chamber Music. She was the winner of several competitions in Russia, performing the Mendelssohn Concerto with the North Ossetiya Republic Symphony Orchestra, and the Brahms violin concerto with the Rostov-on-Don Philharmonic Orchestra. In Canada, Oxana won the Saskatchewan Concerto Competition and performed the Szymanowsky Concerto with the Saskatoon and Regina Symphonies. She has also been an orchestral member of the Timmins and Regina Symphonies, and is presently Principal Second Violinist of the Saskatoon Symphony and performs with the Saskatoon Symphony Chamber Players and Elixir. She is the founder and Director of the Saskatoon Conservatory of Music.



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

Glen Gillis

Glen Gillis, Professor of Music, conducts the Concert Band and several other ensembles at the University of Saskatchewan. He teaches conducting, saxophone, and music education courses, and works with graduate students in the music education and performance streams. Dr. Gillis is a Conn-Selmer Artist/Clinician and has performed in North America, Continental Europe, Iceland, and China as well as over fifty conferences such as the World Saxophone Congress, the Saxophone Symposium, and the North American Saxophone Alliance Biennial and Regional



Conferences. Recently he and his collaborative partner, Duo Gillis Cunningham (DGC), were selected and presented a lecture/performance at the TEDx Usask 2023.

As an educator his career began in the Saskatoon Public Schools where his concert and jazz ensembles received numerous awards and noted for their advanced musical performances. At the university level his career continued in Missouri and Oklahoma where he conducted concert/jazz bands and the Lawton Philharmonic. Upon returning to Canada, he directed the U of S Wind Orchestra from 2001-2010 and released three commercial albums in 2005, 2007, and 2009, and guest conducted the Saskatoon Symphony Orchestra on four occasions. In 2005 he created the North Saskatchewan Wind Symphony, a community ensemble comprised of some of the finest wind and percussion players from Saskatoon and the surrounding area.

As a scholar, he has written many articles that appear in the Canadian Music Educator and Canadian Winds on various subjects about conducting, woodwind pedagogy, and music education. He has contributed to The Encyclopedia of Music in Canada, Teaching Music through Performance in Band (Vol. X), and Teaching Music through Performance in Middle School Band. He has presented research papers or clinics at several international and national music conferences.

To date Dr. Gillis has composed 13 works for wind band at the grade 2-4 levels and over 30 works for saxophone at the grade 4-6 levels. As a member of SOCAN (Society of Composers, Authors, and Music Publishers of Canada), his diverse performance career and musical experience has spanned for nearly four decades in the realms of classical and jazz, with many published compositions for saxophone, and wind band. He released SaxSpectrum (2009), SaxSpectrum 2 (2014) and SaxSpectrum 3 (2021 double album) through the MSR Classics label performing and displaying many of his compositions and commissioned works, all world premiere recordings. SaxSpectrum 2 also received a nomination for the 2015 Instrumental Recording of the Year from the Western Canadian Music Awards. In 2020 he co-released an album with didgeridooist, Dr. James Cunningham on DGC Sonic Eclipse through Hoot/Wisdom Recordings (Boca, Raton, Florida). He can also be heard on didgeridoo.diversions (Hoot/Wisdom Recordings 2007) and Devotion (Ice Music Press 2015).

In the last four decades Dr. Gillis has commissioned numerous works for classical saxophone and has collaborated with many artist musicians, conductors, and composers. He has matriculated many saxophone students at the high school and college level who have received provincial and national awards. As an original member of the Saskatoon Saxophone Quartet, he leads the ensemble that performs for special functions in and around Saskatoon.

He earned a Bachelor of Music in Music Education degree from the University of Saskatchewan, a Master of Music degree from Northwestern University, and a PH.D. from the University of Missouri.




