



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KEY ELEMENTS OF OUR CURRICULUM

LINGUISTIC COMPETENCE

- Use multicultural literacy books as our main reading resources
- Practice target language through a variety of reading and writing activities
- Focus on communicative proficiency



INTERACTIVE DISCOVERY

- Gain knowledge and awareness of different social groups via relevant problems and authentic experiences shared by peers and adults
- Engage in meaningful conversations on diversity, identity and inclusion. All topics designed at the child's cognitive development level in different age groups



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Engage in community learning with peers and adults from a variety of backgrounds
- Practice asking courageous questions in a safe, encouraging environment



CULTURAL AWARENESS

- Gain ability to acquire new knowledge of a culture and cultural practices, and relate to one's own culture
- Foster curiosity and openness, readiness to suspend disbelief about other cultures and belief about one's own culture



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
