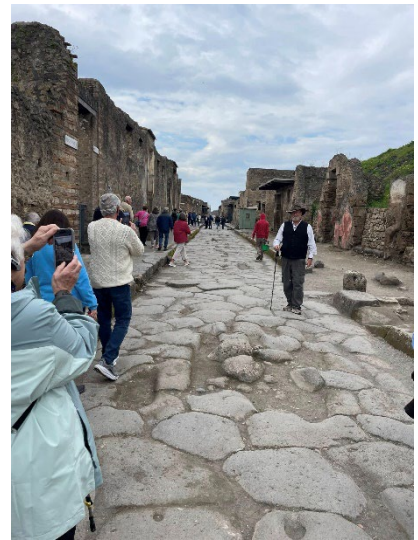


Princess Mediterranean cruise

250TH American Anniversary

Our trip started out in Boston. From there, we traveled to Lexington



and Concord to visit where the first shots of the Revolutionary War were fired. We saw the Lexington Battle Green and the Old North Bridge, where the “shot heard round the world “, was fired in 1775.

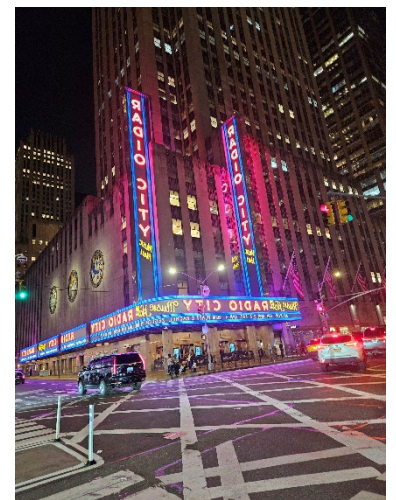
While we were in Boston, we got to walk the Freedom trail and see many places that were part of the history of the revolution.

When we traveled to New York City, we stopped at West Point Academy. We learned why George Washington considered it the most important post in America, the daily routines of the cadets, and



the background of the generals and presidents that graduated from

West Point. The New York City tour took us through Central Park, Times Square, Wall Street, and the 911 Memorial, and the grand finale was going to Broadway



to see Hamilton. The first thing we did in Philadelphia was go to a huge market and get a true Philly cheese steak sandwich and it was delicious. Freedom Hall was next, and we stood in the room where the 13 Colonies gathered to sign the Declaration of Independence and draft the Constitution.

Valley Forge National Park was a stop on the way to Washington DC and we toured the park and the home that George Washington and Martha lived in when the Continental Army was camped there. When we were in DC, we went to the National Archives and saw the original Constitution, the Louisiana Purchase, the letter of the Japanese surrender from World War II among many other artifacts. We visited all of the memorials, and Arlington Cemetery. We walked through George Washington's house in Mount Vernon that sits on a hill with a beautiful view of the Potomac.

The tour guides at the sites were exceptional on this trip. They shared their knowledge in a way that made history alive.

This trip was in chronological order of the Revolutionary War. It started in Boston, the war in New York was lost and they moved to Philadelphia and ended up in Washington DC. It gave us a profound feeling of the history and sacrifices that were made to make this country the United States of America and of the wars fought after that by our brave Americans to keep our country and freedoms intact.
