**Denotes DI area and points of interest

2008 One Cent Sales Tax Program

- Over \$143.7M was collected under the 2008 one cent sales tax program.
- **Clements Ferry Road, Phase 1/\$46.1M-4.1 miles of 4 lane road with medians, turn lanes, signalized intersections, and future MUP.
- * **Clements Ferry Road, Phase 1/Multi-use path-3.7 miles of a multi-use path from Royal Assembly Drive to Forrest Drive. Project was removed from original construction of Clements Ferry Road, Phase 1 based on utility conflicts. Berkeley County is moving forward with ROW acquisition with the assistance from the City of Charleston. An engineering firm has been attained to revise the plans and bid out for construction.

2014 One Cent Sales Tax Program

- Over \$241.8M as of 12/22 should be collected under the 2014 one cent sales tax program with a \$259.3 projection.
- **Clements Ferry Road, Phase 2/\$76.0M-4.5 miles of 4 lane roads with medians, turn lanes, sidewalks, MUP, signalized intersections, bridge replacements, and major utility relocations. NTP 12/14/20, Completion date 11/30/24.

**DI Roundabout/\$2M

- Intersection improvement at Daniel Island Dr. and Seven Farms Dr.
- SCDOT Projects
 - Includes Interchange, Resurfacing, Preservation, Bridge Replacements, Widening and Safety Improvements:
 - **Cainhoy Road resurfacing/Clements Ferry Road to Hagan Avenue (Nucor entrance)-4.8 miles /\$2.6M-completion 07/31/23
 - **Cainhoy Road mitigation and resurfacing/Hagan Avenue to SC 41 (8.21 miles) /\$4.5M-contract awarded 11/22
 - **I-526 East Widening from Rivers Avenue to US 17/\$4B
 - I-526 West Widening from Rivers Avenue to Paul Cantrell/\$3B
- CTC road resurfacing
 - In Berkeley County, there are over 1068 miles of State paved roads and over 330 miles of County paved roads.
 - > County/City/Local roads-NTP 12/10/21, Completion date 09/06/22.
 - **Seven Farms Dr. overlay / \$560K-completed
 - **Seven Farms Dr. crosswalk improvements / \$190K-completed NOTE: Funded by the City of CHS
 - **Daniel Island Dr. resurfacing/St. Thomas Island Dr. to the roundabout at Sevens Farms Drive. NOTE: Receive bids 02/02/23
- Other projects
 - **Bridge replacement on Daniel Island Dr. at Beresford Creek Note: Managed by the City of Charleston
- Capital Projects
 - **DI Library Parking Lot Expansion/Expand existing parking lot to add an additional 56 parking spaces. Note: Budgeted \$88K/Completion scheduled end of 04/23


