• Credit Card Acceptance

• Customs & Entry Requirements

 Visitors from the U.S., Canada, and the EU do not need a visa for stays under 180 days. You must have 180 days remaining on your passport the day you enter.

• Electricity Voltage & Plug Type

 Mexico uses 110V electricity, the same as the U.S. and Canada, so travelers from these countries will not need a voltage converter. The plug type is Type A and B, similar to the U.S.

Pharmacies & Medications

O Pharmacies in Mexico are well-stocked, and many medications are available without a prescription. However, controlled substances require a doctor's prescription. If you need specific medications, bring a copy of your prescription to avoid issues.

Additional Tips

- Safety: Stick to well-known areas, avoid flashing valuables, and use rideshare apps like Uber
- Water: Do not drink tap water—opt for bottled or purified water.
- Language: Spanish is the official language, but English is widely spoken in tourist areas.
- **Customs**: Always exchange greetings before engaging in conversation. Use Google translate or another language app if needed.
