## News about the Tanque Verde/Houghton Housing Development Project

The developer is still refining plans for the project to build 80+ townhome style residences on the Northeast corner of TV and Houghton Roads. This property is now in the City of Tucson and our representative, Jim Christy, has little to no input in the matter with the City Council although his office is trying to oppose the project as the local populace is not in favor of it. The next step in the process is for the City to rezone the land so the development can proceed. There was supposed to be an open council hearing on this sometime in March, but all large group meetings were canceled. There has been no date posted as to when it will be rescheduled. ## How to: Join nextdoor.com

To connect with your neighbors, you'll need to create an account on Nextdoor. You do not need an invitation to join Nextdoor. But, if you received an invitation, please follow the instructions below and enter your code when requested.

1. Visit [www.nextdoor.com](http://www.nextdoor.com)
2. Enter your residential street address and email address
3. Select "Find your neighborhood". At this point, one of two things will happen:
  - a. If there is an existing Nextdoor website for your neighborhood, you will automatically be assigned to that neighborhood.
  - b. If there is not an existing Nextdoor website for your neighborhood, you will be given the option to create one.
4. Complete all required field.
5. If you received an invitation to join Nextdoor, select "Have an invitation code?" and enter the code on the invitation letter in order to give your neighborhood credit for inviting you.
6. Click "Sign Up"
7. Finally, verify your address.

Note: Nextdoor does not support the use of P. O. Boxes. Members must join using their physical address.

## How to: Create an USPS account

Create your USPS account for mail and package notification on-line. Get email or text messages each day informing you what will be delivered. The link to UPPS for this service is: <https://informedelivery.usps.com/box/pages/intro/start.action>

1. Create your account (Use your USPS.com account or sign up for one today.)
2. Verify your identity (Protect your privacy and personal information by verifying your identity and address)
3. Receive notifications (View notifications for smartphone, tablet, or computer)

**Secure access** – Interact with your incoming mail and packages on the secure, on-line dashboard.

**Preview incoming mail** – View grayscale images of the exterior, address side of letter-sized mail-pieces scheduled to arrive soon.

**Track packages** – Check the delivery status of packages and when the packages are scheduled to arrive

**Delivery instructions** – Leave delivery instructions if you will not be home to accept packages.

**Schedule redelivery** – Missed at delivery? Schedule a package to be re-delivered.

**Manage notifications** – Set up email and / or text notifications to track the delivery status of your packages.

## Neighborhood Information and Business



### STREET SAFETY

It is important to slow down and watch out for our children, walkers, joggers, bicyclists, and others when driving on our streets. Please remember these friendly reminders when using our streets:

1. Walk against traffic
2. Jog against traffic
3. Bicycle with traffic
- 4. Observe the 25 MPH speed limit**
5. When driving a golf cart, drive with traffic
6. At night wear colorful or reflective clothing and use a flashlight!
7. Do not walk in the middle of the street or three or four abreast
8. Have your dog(s) on a leash
9. Pull trashcans off the street in a reasonable time.
10. Save your texting for a later time.
11. Do not drive in the unpaved washes

**Remember, the roads are Public roads.**  
**Only licensed drivers may drive on them... including golf cars!**

### Does your home look good?

Have you ever walked behind your home and looked at it from a fresh and more critical perspective? What do you *really* see? Remember that if you have a home along the golf course, your yard obligations don't end at just your front yard! Your obligations ALSO include the back of your home that abuts the golf course! The golf course owner has spent a tremendous amount of money making the golf course look good for you and its players - and YOU need to return the favor by having your property look good from their point of view too! Please be a good neighbor and give the portion of your landscape that is visible from the golf course proper attention. Thank you for helping to keep ALL our property values up!

### Where to stack your wood

Most of us living here in 49ers are fortunate to have wood-burning fireplaces, fire pits or similar. But did you know that our CC&Rs specifically mention where you can store your wood supply? Specifically: "...wood piles or storage piles shall be walled in or kept screened by adequate planting, walls or other means in such manner as to conceal them from the view of the neighboring lots, streets or from the view of the golf course property."

In short, this means the only person that can see your woodpile, is you!



## Trailers in the Forty-Niners Country Club Estates

The CC&Rs state that no trailers placed on lots. However, your HOA Board allows you to keep a trailer at your house if:

- 1) the trailer is stored in your enclosed garage or
- 2) in your backyard behind a solid (not see-through) gate, so long as the trailer does not protrude above your wall and cannot be seen from the view of the neighboring homes, streets or from the view of the golf course property.
