STREET SAFETY

It is important to slow down and watch out for our children, walkers, joggers, bicyclists, and others when driving on our streets. Please remember these friendly reminders when using our streets:

- 1. Walk against traffic
- 2. Jog against traffic
- 3. Bicycle with traffic
- 4. Observe the 25 MPH speed limit
- 5. When driving a golf cart, drive with traffic
- 6. At night wear colorful or reflective clothing and use a flashlight!
- 7. Do not walk in the middle of the street or three or four abreast
- 8. Have your dog(s) on a leash
- 9. Pull trashcans off the street in a reasonable time.
- 10. Save your texting for a later time.

REMINDER...

As stated in our CC&Rs, all trailers, no matter how great you think they look, must be stored OUT OF SIGHT in either your garage or in your backyard so as not to be seen from the street, your neighbors' house, or from the golf course! If you are unable to store your trailer in the above manner, you must store it OFFSITE.

DO YOU LOOK GOOD FROM BEHIND?

Have you ever walked behind your home and looked at it from a fresh and more critical perspective? What do you *really* see? Remember that if you have a home along the golf course, your yard obligations don't end at just your front yard! Your obligations ALSO include the back of your home that abuts the golf course! The golf course owner has spent a tremendous amount of money making the golf course look good for you and its players - and YOU need to return the favor by having your property look good from their point of view too! Please be a good neighbor and give the portion of your landscape that is visible from the golf course proper attention. Thank you for helping to keep ALL of our property values up!

Please remember enforcement of our CC&Rs is necessary to help protect our home values. Your HOA Board has been working extremely hard to make sure our CC&Rs are upheld and in the process has spent many dollars in legal fees. This expenditure is frustrating as we have such SIMPLE rules to follow and EASY ways for everyone to get information and approval for their projects (see www.49ersHOA.com). By purchasing our homes here in 49ers, we all agreed to abide by our deed restrictions and governing documents. Of course we all can make mistakes, so if you ever get a letter indicating such a mistake, we ask that you quickly contact us and help rectify the situation.

This simple act will avoid unnecessary legal costs and preserve our HOA funds.

TREES & WASHES

The Country Club will be doing large amounts of pruning and trimming of trees throughout the entire property. SECURITY

We are pleased that the Forty Niner security patrols consistently report that there is no suspicious activity throughout our amazing community. The feeding of domestic free-roaming animals or our indigenous wild critters is a hazard to the community and not recommended. Recently we have had reports of incidents where coyotes were acting aggressively during the daytime and that can be a concern for all.

What's Up in the 49?

Tanque Verde Valley News

There is always something going on in our Tanque Verde Valley! The US Forest Service is still collaborating with the Friends of Redington Pass to refine plans for the forest area surrounding our valley. Multi-interest user groups continue to meet monthly to develop ideas and solutions for Redington Pass. The major issues include wildcat shooting, littering, off-road vehicle use, hiking trails and parking. The USFS Senior Manager, Jim Upchurch, will be leaving which may delay some of the Forest Service plans. There have been no further details released on a proposed shooting range in Redington Pass.

Pima County Supervisor Ray Carroll held a town hall style meeting on March 26 to engage his constituents on current issues. Included were representatives from the Pima County Sheriffs Department (Chris Danos) and Transportation (John Bernal). The first part of the meeting dealt with local traffic problems, particularly speeding in the Bel Air Ranch Estates and along Fort Lowell Road. The second part of the meeting was concerning county plans and where our money goes for roads. The Pima County 20 year plan is considering adding a bridge and widening Tanque Verde Loop Road to 80 feet (presently 65'). The road is a designated a "Scenic Route" and should remain so. Apparently, there was a mistake made on the maps which labeled it a major route with potential widening. This error should be corrected on future county maps. When Mr. Bernal was asked if there is a bridge planned for or any plans to fix Wentworth Road to prevent flooding in the 49er development, he stated that there were no plans to do so and this was an Army Corps of Engineers and HOA issue. There was discussion on where our taxes go

for road improvement and handouts were provided to each attendee.
