

The Friends of Redington Pass (FRP) are finalizing their recommendations on the Collaborative Area Management Plan (CAMP) which will go to the U.S. Forest Service (USFS) before the summer to help shape their final plans for land use in Redington pass. The majority of the conflicts and issues in the Pass are caused by a small minority of the users. With a predicted increase of recreational users in the area, FRP and the USFS are trying to proactively plan for the future so all users and visitors can co-exist peacefully. The CAMP will include a recommendation on the proposed gun shooting range by the Tucson Rod and Gun Club. They expect to hold a public meeting for comment in the next few months and will notify the public of the date and location. They are also scheduling a clean-up day for the Pass on May 7th with details to be published on their website at **www.friendsofredingtonpass.org**.

STREET SAFETY

It is important to slow down and watch out for our children, walkers, joggers, bicyclists, and others when driving on our streets. Please remember these friendly reminders when using our streets:

- 1. Walk against traffic
- 2. Jog against traffic
- 3. Bicycle with traffic
- 4. Observe the 25 MPH speed limit
- 5. When driving a golf cart, drive with traffic
- 6. At night wear colorful or reflective clothing and use a flashlight!
- 7. Do not walk in the middle of the street or three or four abreast
- 8. Have your dog(s) on a leash
- 9. Pull trashcans off the street in a reasonable time.
- 10. Save your texting for a later time.

REMINDER...

As stated in our CC&Rs, all trailers, no matter how great you think they look, must be stored OUT OF SIGHT in either your garage or in your backyard so as not to be seen from the street, your neighbors' house, or from the golf course! If you are unable to store your trailer in the above manner, you must store it OFFSITE.

DO YOU LOOK GOOD FROM BEHIND?

Have you ever walked behind your home and looked at it from a fresh and more critical perspective? What do you *really* see? Remember that if you have a home along the golf course, your yard obligations don't end at just your front yard! Your obligations ALSO include the back of your home that abuts the golf course! The golf course owner has spent a tremendous amount of money making the golf course look good for you and its players - and YOU need to return the favor by having your property look good from their point of view too! Please be a good neighbor and give the portion of your landscape that is visible from the golf course proper attention. Thank you for helping to keep ALL of our property values up!

Please remember enforcement of our CC&Rs is necessary to help protect our home values. Your HOA Board has been working extremely hard to make sure our CC&Rs are upheld and in the process has spent many dollars in legal fees. This expenditure is frustrating as we have such SIMPLE rules to follow and EASY ways for everyone to get information and approval for their projects (see www.49ersHOA.com). By purchasing our homes here in 49ers, we all agreed to abide by our deed restrictions and governing documents. Of course we all can make mistakes, so if you ever get a letter indicating such a mistake, we ask that you quickly contact us and help rectify the situation.

This simple act will avoid unnecessary legal costs and preserve our HOA funds.

Vacation Tips

School will be out soon, and summer vacations are about to get under way. While vacationers are a favorite target for thieves, you can leave your worries behind by using common sense and following a few simple precautions. Make your vacation a memorable one...Don't let thieves steal your summer fun!

- Before you leave home, record the information on your credit cards and serial numbers of any valuable equipment that you plan to bring. Copy your passport and other important documents and secure the information in a safe place.
- Make sure that all doors and windows of your home are securely locked before you leave.
- Stop mail and newspaper delivery, or ask a neighbor to pick them up every day.
- Create the illusion that you are home; use timers to turn lights, the television, or a radio on and off during the day and night.
- Avoid grab-and-go at gas stations: Lock your car doors and roll up your windows when you park.
- Stick to well-lighted areas and well-traveled streets.
- Select ATM machines in visible and well-lighted locations.
- Keep valuables out of sight or in the trunk.
- Avoid leaving valuables in you r hotel room. If necessary use a hotel safe.
- Verify any unexpected visitor or delivery person by calling the front desk and asking to see identification.
- Review your family's safety rules with your children.
- Make sure that everyone in your party adults, teens, and children has the name, address, and phone number of the place you are staying and carries that information at all times.
- Set up rules for each day's outings on where and how you'll link up if you become separated. Agree on a meeting place, just in case.
