## What's Up in the 49?




### Tanque Verde Valley News

The City of Tucson has recently annexed property East of Houghton Road starting with the Desert Willow development to the northeast of the intersection of Tanque Verde and Houghton Roads. There has been a request to change the zoning of the property between the Circle K and the westernmost homes in Bel Air Ranch Estates from resident to general business. The current property owners have plans to build an RV and trailer storage area. This proposal is opposed by the Tanque Verde Valley Association because of potential problems with traffic flow in close proximity to Emily Gray, the bus barn, Circle K, the pedestrian HAWK crossing and other issues associated with a business located next to residential homes. Homeowners should contact the Pima County Board of supervisors to express their opinion on the issue as they will decide on the change in zoning. Efforts to finalize the long term plans for Redington Pass continue and there have been no further details release by the Forest Service or the Tucson Rod and Gun Club on a proposed shooting range.

# We hope you are enjoying these nice cool days...a good break from another hot Tucson summer!!

Our annual golf course overseeding is underway. The golf course, and practice greens will be closed through Friday October 14th. The rainy weather early in our overseeding process delayed us a little bit, but you can never complain about rain in the desert!! We will most likely be CART PATH ONLY for 7-10 days after re-opening, depending on weather conditions.

Our plan is to overseed tee tops, fairways, greens and green surrounds. We are not overseeding many of the roughs, especially areas that have seen good Bermuda growth, which is most of the golf course. In areas that have not seen good Bermuda fill in this summer, we will overseed them to give good winter playability.

Our extensive Bermuda sprigging program this summer resulted in very positive results on various locations on the course. This, in addition to all of the irrigation relocation projects we have completed, should help us continue to improve our year round conditions.

Something new this year, the Driving Range is open during overseeding...so come on down and enjoy a "Beer and a Bucket" for only \$7!

The Golf Shop and Driving Range will be open daily from 8am

to 4pm. The 49er Fitness Center and Pool will remain open regular hours from 5am to 9:30pm. And the Rincon Mountain Grill will remain open daily from 6:30am to 9pm, serving breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

A reminder, the irrigation system will be running 24 hours a day while we are overseeding. It is VERY important that we keep people and vehicles off of the newly planted grass seed. Please help us to inform people to stay off the tee, greens and fairways!! We encourage you to let us know if you see any major leaks or geysers coming from the irrigation system. We are excited for this time of year, it's always a chance for us to re-charge our batteries and be ready to provide you with the highest level of customer service around!



# CC&R Update! The Official Voting Results from Alter & Alter CPAs are in:

Proposed Amendment:	Yes	No
#1 Mandatory Membership	128	70
#2 Trailers	129	66
#3 Motor Homes	132	62
#4 Commercial Vehicles	131	65
<b>#5 Non-Operative Vehicles</b>	143	55
#6 Machinery	142	56
#7 Architectural Changes	133	64

A "super majority" was required to pass each amendment. None of the amendments received the 2/3 vote to enable passage. 218 votes were needed to pass each amendment. Only 198 of our 326 homeowner/lot owners participated in the vote. Note: Total votes are not equal as not every Amendment was voted on every Ballot.

# Neighborhood Business

### STREET SAFETY

It is important to slow down and watch out for our children, walkers, joggers, bicyclists, and others when driving on our streets. Please remember these friendly reminders when using our streets:

- 1. Walk against traffic
- 2. Jog against traffic
- 3. Bicycle with traffic
- 4. Observe the 25 MPH speed limit
- 5. When driving a golf cart, drive with traffic
- 6. At night wear colorful or reflective clothing and use a flashlight!
- 7. Do not walk in the middle of the street or three or four abreast
- 8. Have your dog(s) on a leash
- 9. Pull trashcans off the street in a reasonable time.
- 10. Save your texting for a later time.

Remember...these are not private roads and therefore only licensed drivers may drive on them...including golf carts!

#### REMINDER...

As stated in our CC&Rs, all trailers, no matter how great you think they look, must be stored OUT OF SIGHT in either your garage or in your backyard so as not to be seen from the street, your neighbors' house, or from the golf course! If you are unable to store your trailer in the above manner, you must store it OFFSITE.
