READY OR NOT, SWEATER WEATHER IS COMING! 10 THINGS TO DO TO PREP YOUR HOME FOR FALL

Grab a pumpkin spiced latte and get ready for for the changing seasons with these ten things to do to prep your home for fall.

1. Clean or replace your gutters

4. Don't forget the outdoor furniture

Just because it's outdoor furniture doesn't mean it's up to snuff with our crazy Midwest winters. If you can't store it, cover it a waterproof furniture cover.

5. Fix any cracks in your driveway

Shrugging off a crack in the driveway, sidewalk, or stoop can turn into a major headache. When water freezes, it expands, and can make the crack even bigger. Enough small cracks can turn into big cracks, and eventually the concrete can crumble.
