Top Ten recommended ways to be prepared for your Championship Tournament:

1. Start your day with prayer! Give thanks for the privilege and opportunity to be able to participate. Ask for Wisdom, Discernment and Humility.
2. Learn and master the skill of fishing as a team. BCSC is a team event. Share honest and whole truth information. The successful outcome will be worth it. Being a good teammate and being supportive is very important.
3. Always be prepared and learn how to master time management. Spend as much time as possible on your championship lake. Try and coordinate your practice time with your co-angler when possible. Don't exaggerate your practice weights. Try not to overfish your fish during practice. Use actual weights to help you improve.
4. Be prepared for at great day on the water. Proper boat prep is essential. Get with your boater and offer assistance wherever needed. Make sure you and your co-angler have a valid fishing license.
5. Anglers equipment prep is very essential. Have a no excuse type attitude when you start the day. Have the proper Rods, Reels, Line and Line Size, Hooks, Weights and Lures to get the job done. Be willing to share if needed. Continue the teamwork mindset.
6. Take the time to read and understand the tournament rules. Read them together prior to the event. You may have to schedule a time. This is very important to your success. Don't be afraid or embarrassed to ask for clarification prior to the event.
7. Get yourself mentally prepared for your tournament. Follow your own pre tournament ritual. Only you know what works best for you.
8. Determine in advance how your team will handle your team success. Write it down and both team members keep a copy. Never assume you on the same page.
9. The night before your tournament get your fuel and get plenty of water and snacks. Try your best to get a good night sleep. You want to be at your best for your tournament and you want to always give yourself enough time to get to the ramp on time and safe.
10. Tournament day, break the day down into small pieces and set attainable goals. Your first goal is getting to the ramp on time. Next have a plan. Try your best to follow the plan if possible but be willing to adjust if necessary. Try not to focus on catching a limit. Use that energy to focus on getting that first bite and catching a keeper fish and then focus on repeating the process 5 times. The rest of the day will take care of itself with proper team work.

Commit to having a good time regardless of the outcome. The blessing is in the opportunity not the reward. Stay safe on the water and be blessed in your efforts. Your success will Come!
