## Hall of Fame - Categories & Qualifying Prerequisites

## **Minimum Qualifications**

All nominees must have significant achievements in or contributions to the sport of military rodeo. Nominees can be a Contestant, Stock Contractor, Contract Personnel, Rodeo Producer, Rodeo Committee Member or other Notable that has made a significant contribution to the advancement of military rodeo. Inductees can be a Contestant, Stock Contractor, Contract Personnel, Rodeo Producer, Rodeo Committee Member, or other Notable that has significant achievements in or made a significant contribution to the advancement of military rodeo. Inductees must have been a member of the United States Armed Forces as active duty, retired, active/inactive reserve or Guard component or dependent of these units and competed in military rodeos verified and approved by the Board of Directors. Stock Contractors, Contract Acts, Rodeo Committees, Rodeo Promoters, and other Notables may not have to meet these requirements; however, they must have made significant contributions to military rodeos to be considered. Members of the Armed Forces with less than an Honorable discharge are ineligible for consideration. Verification of service by inductees shall be completed prior to induction.

## **Nomination Categories**

- *Contestants* individual must have competed in military rodeos according to the minimum qualifications above and can be considered in Bareback, Saddle Bronc, Bull Riding, Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Chute Dogging, Team Roping, Barrel Racing or All Around.
- *Stock Contractors* Must have been actively engaged in producing military rodeos.
- *Contract Personnel* Must have been actively engaged with military rodeos. Examples: announcers, clowns, judges, timers, specialty acts, pickup men, secretaries, photographers.
- Rodeo Producers and/or Rodeo Committee Persons Must have been actively engaged with military rodeos. Will be inducted as a *Notable*. Eligibility is based on individual's contributions to the sport while serving as a member of his/her local committee.
- *Notables and Notables Lifetime Achievement* Eligibility based on individual's contributions to the sport of military rodeo. Example: Persons who have made significant contributions toward the advancement of military rodeo who are not otherwise eligible in other categories. The Lifetime Achievement category is reserved for posthumous inductions only.
