Alumni Corporation Update

Hello to all, John Carey here, class of '78, Alpha Chi Board of Director. It's good to be in touch and I'm happy to have talked or corresponded with many Alumni and Actives over the last several months. Thanks for all your thoughts and to those who have stepped up to get involved. Most of all thanks to those who have been there to keep the Alumni Chapter together as many of us have been away and not as involved as we might be.

Last January I received an admittedly upsetting e-mail and follow-up phone call in regards to our active chapter. I was told that we had a hazing incident; that we representatives from Theta Chi National were to be on campus; that we had been on probation and that National and the University might suspend our charter. It seemed serious and I was concerned. It had been a

year and a half since I was last at the house, things seemed well and I assumed going OK. I've always kept in touch with brothers of my vintage but in reality didn't have that much information as to how the active chapter was doing other than cursory comments or fleeting insight of someone who had passed through. Communications between alumni was not what it should be.

Not knowing what was really going on and wanting to help out, I started making phone calls. I reached out to a number of alumni, mostly guys from the 70's and 80's that I knew. We needed to get a few of us up to the house for an Alumni Board of Review that coming weekend. The following Saturday Dave Hess '79, Brad

Boyer '78, Frank Hunt '76, Chuck Lowe '79 and I met with a representative from National. We broke off into pairs and then met with all of the active brothers individually. We found that we have a lot of great actives but without going into great detail we did have a hazing incident which shouldn't have happened. Rules which had been set up by Theta Chi National and SU were broken. Five actives were found to be fault, and as chapter Alumni members we voted on their suspension as active brothers. We placed the active chapter on probation with a check list of requirements and training to be fulfilled within the following few months. In the weeks prior to this a new Active Chapter President, Zack Glascock '12, and a set of officers were elected. The suspended brothers will become Alumni members in good standing upon their graduation but are not currently part of the active chapter. As an alumni member, a past active officer, and a Alumni board member the suspensions and probation period were unfortunate but the right thing to do.

What troubled me more, was the larger issue of where we had let ourselves go as an Alumni Corporation. I'd been aware that we had some severe financial issues in the late 90's. Fortunately we got through because of the efforts of a few brothers who stepped up, took the bull by the horns and pointed us all in the right direction. We got through but we might not have. This was only a couple of years before a high light in the history of our Chapter—the 75th Anniversary. What became obvious is that over the last few years we had a few loyal alumni that have been holding things together. Most of the rest of us were missing in action and assuming the best. We had just a few Brothers putting in a great deal of their own time and resources, just to keep us going. We owe them a debt. The rest of us as Alumni haven't consistently been there to provide the checks and balances to make sure we don't have problems.

Maybe this will all serve to give us a wake-up call. Our bills are being paid in a timely manner, we have money in the bank and reasonable financial stability. The guys are eating ok and the chapter house is getting regular maintenance but as always is in need of some work. For the most part things have been good, but the hazing incident points out where we have gone astray and gotten into trouble.

We also found that the actives haven't been following rituals, and there were a couple of other incidents that put the active chapter on the University and National Chapter's "radar screen". As an Alumni Corporation we haven't been holding regular meetings or communicating the way we should be to each other, and to the actives. We also haven't been following our by-laws; and the by-laws we have don't reflect present day needs of the Chapter. As such we decided in January that we needed an Alumni meeting and one was planned for April to coincide with Founders Day.

Many e-mails were sent and conversations held between January and April. Our Facebook page and Chapter website were helpful in getting the word out. In April we had a good turn out and great discussion. We met with the Active Chapter and had a wonderful bar-b-que. During the Alumni meeting we voted for our five new board of directors- myself, Brad Boyer '78, Bob Moses '85, Doug Thomson '86 and John Wanat '90. The Board in turn (and as per our By-laws) (re) appointed our alumni officers. With that completed we seemed to be a legally operating entity again.

Ryan Walsh as Alumni President and our other officers then gave reports as to the status of the House, our finances and some operational details. New committees were set up to follow up on our current needs: communications, by-laws, operations and house maintenance, finances, etc.

We are in a good place now but we need to continue on. The actives are doing what they need to and we will need to keep in touch. This summer a new floor was installed in the living room and much of the rest of the first floor refinished. Additional work is being planned and funds will need to be raised. Please consider donating to our capital campaign. At this fall's Homecoming (10 Nov) we plan on presenting a new revised set of Corporate by-laws to be voted on. Efforts are being made to reconnect to "missing alumni" and to update our contact lists. Other items are in the works.

There are things to be done but there are many of us. Over 1,100 brothers have been part of the Alpha Chi Chapter dating back to our local founding almost 90 years ago. Let us keep it going, we owe it to ourselves, those who were there before us, those there now and those brothers to come. Let us lend a helping hand and spread the weight of what needs to be done. Thanks to all.
