The Tri-City Valley Cats are a professional baseball franchise and have been a summer staple in the Capital Region since 2002!

The team focuses on creating a family-friendly entertainment experience across the backdrop of high-quality, professional baseball Last season, the Cats dinched their first Frontier League playoff berth, and hosted the Wild Card Came at "The Joe", a one-game playoff against the Ottawa Titans.

Since 2002, 117 former Valley Cats have graduated from their time at "The Joe" to play Major League Baseball That growing list includes 4x batting champion Jose Altuve, World Series MVPs Ben Zobrist, George Springer, and Jeremy Pena, Gy Young Award Winner Dallas Keuchel, and complete-game no-hitters thrown by Framber Valdez, Ronel Blanco, and Joe Musgrove.

Kumar Rocker made his professional debut with the Cats before being selected third overall in the 2022 MIBD raft by the Texas Rangers and was one of three former Valley Cats to make their MLB debutstn 2024

Since 2021, 17 Cats have joined Major League organizations, including Nick DeCarlo (Milwaukee Brewers) and Miguel Useche (Chicago Cubs), whose contracts were purchased in 2025, 2024 Cat Zeke Wood recently signed with the St. Louis Cardinals too. This year has featured the MLB debuts of Carson McCusker (*21-23) and Ryan Gusto (*19). The Valley Cats' Frontier League rosters have included former big leagues Aaron Althern, Willy Garcia, Ryan Hartman, Reymin Guduan, and Denis Phipps.

As the region's professional baseball team, the organization makes itapriority to be an active and supportive member of our community, The Valley Cats make a positive economis impact annually with 200 in-season employees and 135,000 fans visiting the ball park for games and special events.

These alternates honor the rich history of Troy, NY, also known as the Collar City. These uniforms proudly represent the baseball lineage of the area that the ValleyCats call home. Fitted Collar City Cats hats, shirts, jerseys, and hoodies are available in SouthPaw's Den.

Specifically, Troy is home to the "detachable collar" and the "bishop collar", which were central during the industrial revolution. The 'Cats are paying homage to the impact that the collar industry had on Troy. At the turn of the 20th century, 15,000 people worked in the collar industry in Troy, 85% of which were women, and 90% of collars made in the United States at the time came from Troy. The riverfront was dotted with collar factories as well with many of those industrial buildings repurposed or redeveloped as part of the city's rebirth.

Furthermore, professional baseball teams such as the Troy Haymakers (1871-72) and the Troy Trojans (1879-82) came to the Collar City in the late 19th century. The lineage of the San Francisco Giants can be traced back to the Trojans with the Giants returning their 2010 World Series trophy for an event at Joe Bruno Stadium to celebrate this history in 2011. The 'Cats have honored Troy's baseball heritage in the past as Hall of Famer Johnny Evers (1946) was a Troy native, and had his very own bobblehead in 2014. As a whole, the Haymakers and the Trojans sported five Hall of Famers in Buck Ewing (1939), Roger Connor (1945), Dan Brouthers (1945), Tim Keefe (1964), and Mickey Welch (1973).

The ValleyCats have crafted a throwback design with green lettering across the chest, green numbers on the back, and a cream colored jersey with pants that have green piping. The Collar City Cats logo also features interlocking collars with an alternate mark including an iron to pay tribute to the city's heritage. We are excited to don these NOVUS jerseys to recognize Troy's baseball and industrial history!







If a player reaches base, you can indicate it by drawing a line that indicates how far along the diamond the player has progressed, while also writing down the corresponding abbreviation (below) relating to the play that occured.

In the example above, James hit a single and stole second base. Roberts hit a flyball out to center field, and was followed by Murphy, who hit a two-RBI home run, driving in James. Following the home run, Sanchez reached base on an error by the second baseman, and Simmons ended the inning by hitting into a double play to the shortstop, who threw to the second baseman, who then threw to first.


