## WHO WE ARE

The Tri-City ValleyCats are a professional baseball franchise located in the heart of New York's Capital Region! The team focuses on creating a family-friendly entertainment experience across the backdrop of high-quality, professional baseball. The ValleyCats were a long-time affiliate of the Houston Astros and competed as a member of the New York-Penn League for 18 seasons. 108 former ValleyCats players have reached Major League Baseball, including 4x batting champion Jose Altuve, World Series MVPs George Springer and Ben Zobrist, All-Stars J.D. Martinez & Hunter Pence, Cy Young Award Winner Dallas Keuchel, 2020 World Series participants Kike Hernandez and Ryan Thompson, and RHP Andrew Bellatti, the first ValleyCat in the team's Frontier League-era to reach the highest level of professional baseball. In 2022, the ValleyCats made national news, welcoming RHP Kumar Rocker to the team in preparation for the MLB Draft. After five stellar starts with the 'Cats, Rocker was selected third overall by the Texas Rangers, and is currently the organization's #7 prospect as he embarks on his journey from The Joe to The Show! Since their inaugural season in 2002, the Tri-City ValleyCats have welcomed over 2.8 million fans to The Joe! On the field, the team has won eight Stedler Division titles and three New York-Penn League Championships! The 'Cats have also hosted the NYPL All-Star Game twice during that span. The league's signature event was held in Troy in both 2008 and 2017. 2023 marks the club's third season as a member of the Frontier League, an MLB Partner League, and 21st season of affordable family fun and professional baseball in New York's Capital Region.

## WHAT WE OFFER

When you attend a ValleyCats game, baseball is just one part of the appeal! Every night features mascots, music and more as the team strives to provide affordable entertainment for all ages. With unique theme nights, each ballgame is exciting and memorable. There is something for everyone, with fan-favorite staples including their traditional 4th of July celebration, Star Wars Night, Military Appreciation / Veterans Night, Community Heroes, Bark in the Park, Irish Night, Italian Night, Medieval Times, Around the World in 9 Innings, and much more! Bobblehead giveaways have included the Capital Region Heritage Series featuring former 'Cats Jose Altuve, George Springer, J.D. Martinez, Kike Hernandez, and Joe Musgrove, as well as former Albany-Colonie Yankees Derek Jeter, Mariano Rivera, Bernie Williams and Jorge Posada. Other fun bobbleheads have included Jimi Hendrix, Uncle Sam, Michelle Obama, local news personalities Steve Caporizzo and Liz Bishop, as well as Capital Region product and 2021 World Series champ Ian Anderson.

## WHEN

The season spans the months of mid-May to early September, with 51 home games taking place at Joseph L. Bruno Stadium, 13 additional home games as compared to the team's typical New York-Penn League schedule in the past. Special events held at "The Joe" help to fill out the team's calendar, beginning in April and extending through October. Some of these events have included concerts, professional wrestling, movie nights, a 5k road race, weddings, fundraiser events, youth baseball tournaments, various charity walks, and more.

## WHERE WE PLAY

The ValleyCats play their home games at Joseph L. Bruno Stadium, located on the campus of Hudson Valley Community College in Troy. Built in 2002, "The Joe" features 4,500 fixed seats, 10 luxury suites, four unique picnic areas, a wide open-air concourse, two grass berm seating areas, and a 36' x 17' LED video board.

LOUIS, MISSOURI TO QUEBEC CITY, CANADA. THE FRONTIER LEAGUE HAS A RICH TRADITION OF PROFESSIONAL BASEBALL OF THE HIGHEST QUALITY. NUMEROUS PLAYERS, COACHES, UMPIRES, ANNOUNCERS, AND FRONT OFFICE MEMBERS HAVE USED THE FRONTIER LEAGUE AS A JUMPING OFF POINT INTO MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL.**



# TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR VALLEYCATS EVENTS

The term "Event" as used herein includes, but is not limited to, any exhibition, regular season, or post season game. Each individual or entity signing for or using a credential, and his/her/its employers (each signer, user and employer, a "Bearer"), agrees to the following.

1. Each Bearer represents that he or she is acting on specific assignment for a newspaper, press, news or photographic service and that Bearer is authorized to bind himself or herself to any entity with which he or she is affiliated to these terms and conditions.
2. The use of any account, description, picture, photograph, video, audio, reproduction or other information concerning an Event (the "Event Information") other than for news coverage of, or magazines, books, or stories about the Events, or for First Amendment-protected purposes, is prohibited, except (a) by prior written consent of the Commissioner and CEO of the Frontier League or (b) as specifically licensed by Paragraph 6 below. Nothing in these terms and conditions authorizes Bearer to violate the Baseball Entities' trademarks, copyrights, and other proprietary rights. The Baseball Entities are the exclusive owners of, and expressly reserve all rights in, their trademarks, copyrights and other proprietary rights in their names, logos, mascots, and uniform designs.
3. While an Event is in progress, Bearer shall not transmit or aid in transmitting any Event Information on a play-by-play or pitch-by-pitch basis more frequently than once every half-inning of play except to report on a significantly historic and newsworthy event. This limitation shall not apply to internal transmission's between the Bearer and Bearer's employer.
4. While an Event is in progress Bearer shall not transmit, display, or aid in displaying any video, audio, pictures, photographs, or other non-text based accounts or descriptions of the Event that Bearer obtains at that Event in any media, except this limitation shall not apply to internal transmissions between the Bearer attending the Events and such Bearer's employer. The foregoing limitation shall not preclude the on-line transmission or display of up to seven still pictures or photographs of any Event during its progress; provided, however, that under no circumstances may Bearer display any more than seven still pictures or photographs of any Event during its progress.
5. Bearer assumes all risks incidental to the performance by the Bearer of Bearer's services in connection with an Event and assumes all risks incidental to an Event, whether occurring prior to, during or subsequent to the actual playing of the Event, including, but not limited to, the risk of being injured by bats or fragments thereof, and thrown or batted balls, and agrees that the Frontier League, it's members, and all of their constituents, and all of their respective owners, shareholders, affiliated entities, stadium owners and managers, partners, agents, officers, directors, players and other employees (collectively, the "Baseball Entities") shall not be liable for damages including, without limitation, damages for injuries or loss of or damage to personal property or equipment.
6. PICTURES AND PHOTOGRAPHS: The credential confers on a Bearer a limited, non-exclusive and non-transferable license to take pictures and photographs of an Event, and to allow the entity that engaged the Bearer to use them only for news coverage of, or magazines, books or stories about the Event, other editorial purposes, and reprints of news pages from such entity's publications, provided that such use is not likely to create, or does not actually create, confusion in the minds of the trade or public that reprints or elements therein, or the items on which they are reprinted, are sponsored or endorsed by, or affiliated with, any of the Baseball Entities licensed Bearer to use their trademark or copyrights. In exchange for the access granted by the credential, the Baseball Entities shall have the right to purchase prints of any published pictures or photographs taken by the Bearer in connection with the credential at the best financial terms offered to third parties, and such Baseball Entities shall be licensed at no additional charge to use the pictures or photographs for news coverage and promotional purposes. Except as specifically licensed herein, the Baseball Entities maintain that separate consent is required to transmit, offer to sell, or sell, any pictures or photographs featuring their respective trademarks, names, logos, uniform designs, copyrights or other proprietary rights for commercial purposes, including in third party advertisements or promotions, or on posters, T-shirts or other consumer products.
7. AUTOGRAPHS: The use of the credential for the purpose of obtaining autographs is strictly prohibited. Seeking or obtaining autographs from any player, personnel, public figure, or other individual within or adjacent to the ballpark shall subject Bearer to the immediate and permanent revocation of Bearer's credential.
8. THE CREDENTIAL IS NOT TRANSFERABLE AND MAY BE REVOKED AT ANY TIME WITHOUT CAUSE.
9. While within the ballpark, Bearer shall at all times be subject to the direction and/or supervision of the Club and its designated agents or employees.
10. Bearer shall obtain all necessary licenses, consents or releases permitting the use of any party's proprietary material, including, but not limited to, any party's copyrights, trademarks, rights of publicity, rights of privacy or other proprietary or personal rights, however denominated, included in any photograph taken or other material obtained in connection with the credential. The Bearer is solely responsible for determining which licenses, consents and releases shall be obtained. Bearer shall indemnify, defend (if requested) and hold harmless the Baseball Entities against and from any and all claims, liability, loss, damage or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) against third party claims arising out of or relating to: (a) Bearer's use of any Event Information taken or obtained in connection with the credential, including, without limitation, any claim that use of such Event Information infringes any third party's copyrights, trademarks, rights of publicity, rights of privacy, or other proprietary rights, however denominated; (b) Bearer's acts or omissions; (c) the presence on the premises of any cameras, wires, cable or other equipment brought thereon by Bearer; and (d) Bearer's breach of any term of the credential.
11. In the event that the name or the likeness of any individual using this credential is included in any broadcast, telecast, photograph, film, video, or other media taken in connection with an Event, such individual grants the Baseball Entities the non-exclusive, transferable, perpetual right and license to use (and to sub-license the use of) such name and likeness in any media worldwide whether now known or hereafter devised.

# MEDIA POLICIES



- One-on-one interviews are permitted, pending player, coach and staff availability, and must be pre-arranged with a member of the ValleyCats Communications Staff. For one-on-one interview requests, 12-hour notice is suggested
- Pre-game interviews are best following batting practice.
- Post-game interviews are available starting 10 minutes after every game. Pre-game media availability ends one hour before that game's scheduled first pitch.
- Media credentials are for working media only any credential bearer found to be using their credential for personal reasons will immediately and permanently have their credential revoked by a member of the ValleyCats staff and be banned from receiving credentials from the ValleyCats in the future.
- Members of the ValleyCats Communications Staff will secure players and coaches for a post-game media scrum inside the ValleyCats clubhouse. Members of the media are not permitted past the St. Peter's Health Partner's backdrop unless accompanied by a member of the ValleyCats Communications Staff.


# 2023 COACHING STAFF



**Pete Incaviglia** returns to lead the ValleyCats for his third season since joining the organization in 2021, when they embarked into the realm of independent professional baseball. As the skipper of the 'Cats over the last two seasons, the 12-year MLB veteran with over 35 years of professional baseball experience has amassed a 102-86 record. In his second season at the helm of the ValleyCats, Incaviglia became the third manager in team history to eclipse the 100-win mark, joining Ed Romero and Gregg Langbehn. The infamous power hitter, who was named the Player of the (20th) Century by Baseball America, coached Tri-City hitters to a Frontier League-leading 162 home runs, and a .288 team batting average, the third best in the league in 2022.

## Brooks Carey, Pitching Coach

**Brooks Carey** joins the ValleyCats after spending the past four seasons as the New Jersey Jackals' Field Manager. At the helm with the Jackals, Carey captured a 2019 Can-Am League championship, and became the franchise's second-winningest manager of all-time, with 182 wins. Prior to joining the Jackals, the 10th rounder for the Baltimore Orioles in the 1978 MLB Draft was the skipper of the Normal CornBelts, a former member of the Frontier League. Carey led the franchise to their first-ever winning season, and in four seasons amassed a record of 248-230. He has also served as the Pitching Coach for the Sussex Skyhawks (2008 & 2009), the Normal CornBelts (2010 & 2011), and the Evansville Otters (2012).



## Thomas Incaviglia, Third Base & Bench Coach

The nephew of manager Pete Incaviglia, **Thomas Incaviglia** enters his third season as the Third Base and Bench Coach for the Tri-City ValleyCats. Incaviglia played professionally for the Grand Prairie AirHogs of the American Association for two seasons, and played collegiately at Oklahoma State, Texas, and Cal State Monterey Bay, winning an NCAA Division I National Championship with the Longhorns. Thomas has spent the offseason gaining managerial experience in the California Winter League, the Official Winter League of the Frontier League.



- Bryant spent six seasons in the Minors with the Mets, and reached Double-A Binghamton for the first time last year.
- He played for the-then Rockland Boulders in the All-American Baseball Challenge in 2020.
- Bryant faced Tri-City twice in the New York-Penn League. He received a no-decision after hurling five innings of one-run ball at "The Joe" on July 19, 2019. In the same season, he twirled five shutout frames in Brooklyn against the ValleyCats.

The Frontier League will be adopting pitch clock rules to speed up the pace-of-play for the 2023 season. Similar to Major League Baseball, pitchers will have 15 seconds to begin their motion before the pitch clock expires with no one on base. With the runners on base, pitchers will have 20 seconds to begin their motion. Violation of this rule will result in an automatic ball for the batter.

Meanwhile, batters that are not ready in the box when the pitch clock hits eight seconds will be subjected to an automatic strike. In between batters, there will be 30 seconds before a pitcher must deliver a pitch. There will be two minutes and 15 seconds for the next pitch to be thrown when both teams change sides. This break can extend to three minutes up to twice a game in the event of special promotions being aired. If the latter is the case, the home team must notify the field timing coordinator before the game. The field timing coordinator must inform the home press box and home broadcaster. The home press box contact, in turn, needs to relay this information to the visiting broadcaster.

The stoppage of play for an automatic ball or strike will occur once the season opens up, but violations will be given until May 30. Additionally, pitchers will be allowed two disengagements (pick-off/stepping off from the rubber) during each plate appearance. If a pitcher disengages for a third time, and does not pick off a runner than it will be a balk, and the baserunner advances one base. Unlike the automatic ball and strike, disengagement violations will be in effect right from the start of the season.
