How to Enter

- ❖ The schedule and forms can be downloaded from the website www.mareebarodeo.com.au
- ❖ Complete the official entry form using a separate form for each section).
- ❖ Deliver the exhibit to the Bull Bar at Kerribee Park in person.
- ❖ All exhibits for all sections to be delivered on Thursday 9th July between 7.30am – 12 noon. Entries close at 12 noon. Late entries cannot be accepted. Judging begins at 1:30pm.
- ❖ On arrival at the Bull Bar, register your entry/ies with the stewards.
- ❖ Keep the relevant portion to collect your exhibit on Sunday 12th July between 9am and 11am.
- ❖ Strict limit of 2 entries per class, per person.
- ❖ Read the conditions of entry to ensure that your exhibit meets requirements.
- ❖ \$2 per entry to be capped at \$20.00.
- ❖ Chief Steward:

General Conditions of Entry – Applies to all classes unless specified

- ❖ This show is conducted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution and rules of this Association and any regulation which appears within the schedule for individual sections of this show. Should there be any conflict between the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution and rules of this Association and the regulations appearing in the schedule, the constitution, rules and regulations appearing in the schedule of this Association shall prevail.
- ❖ All persons entering any class in this schedule agree to indemnify the Mareeba District Rodeo Association Inc. against liability for any accident, damage, loss or illness to any exhibit, exhibitor or competitor and agree that all competitions are under the complete and total control of the Mareeba District Rodeo Association Inc. whose decision in all matters is final.
- ❖ The Mareeba District Rodeo Association Inc.:
 - Will appoint a chief steward as its representative in all matters.
 - Will appoint a head steward to each section to oversee that section.
 - Will appoint judges whose decision is final.
 - Reserves the right to make any decisions, inclusions or changes to this schedule including Conditions of Entry without further notice.
- ❖ A judge shall not have any information prior to or during judging other than what is provided by the Mareeba District Rodeo Association Inc.
- ❖ Entries will only be accepted on completion of the official entry form. Please use a separate form for each section.
- ❖ Entries will not be accepted over the phone or after the closing date.
- ❖ Stewards may alter the class of the exhibit if they believe it may be to the advantage of the entrant.
- ❖ All exhibits in junior classes must include date of birth on the entry form.
- ❖ The exhibit must be completely the own work of the exhibitor (unless otherwise specified).
- ❖ An exhibit is the actual article to be shown.
- ❖ No exhibit may be entered into more than one class.
- ❖ Cleanliness of all exhibits is essential.
- ❖ All exhibits must have been completed within the last two (2) years.
- ❖ **All exhibits must fit into the exhibit cages with no overhang so the cages can be secured. Cage size: 2400L x 750W x 800H**
- ❖ The committee reserves the right to reject any exhibit or exhibits which may be considered not of sufficient merit to be displayed.
- ❖ It is the judge's decision as to whether prizes are awarded in a section or a class. If in the opinion of the judge, no entry is worthy of a prize then no prize will be awarded. All exhibitors must abide by the judge's decision. Judges' decisions are not subject to appeal or protest.
- ❖ No free passes are available to exhibitors.
- ❖ The marquee will be closed during judging. Only judges and stewards are to be present while judging takes place.
- ❖ **The Ag Show will be open from 9am to 6pm on Saturday**
- ❖ Exhibition of all entries is not guaranteed, but every effort will be made to do so.
- ❖ **Exhibits will only be available for collection from 9am – 11am on Sunday, 12th July 2026 from the Bull Bar, or Wednesday, 15th July 2026 from the Rodeo Secretary's Office.**
- ❖ **Exhibits will not be returned by mail.** All exhibits must be collected by Monday 21st July 2026 or the exhibit becomes the property of the Mareeba District Rodeo Association Inc.
- ❖ No exhibitor can remove their work without presenting their exhibit card to a steward.
- ❖ Exhibit Card (collection portion) is required to collect prize money.

- ❖ Pot plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months prior to exhibiting.

- ❖ Exhibits must have the exhibitor's name, address, section & class number affixed underneath or on the back of the exhibit, so it is not visible to the judge.
- ❖ All fruit cakes are to be displayed on cake boards.
- ❖ For Novelty Cakes artificial ornaments are allowed.
- ❖ Cakes - iced or icing - refers to any type of icings, frostings or toppings with or without decoration - no cream-based toppings or fillings.
- ❖ Iced cakes section (traditional icing) - stamens, tulle, ribbons, baby's breath and plastic pillars are allowed. The base board must be raised on cleats or runners. Dummy cake may be used. Covers would be appreciated to avoid damage etc.
- ❖ Iced Cakes Novice Section is for exhibitors who have never won a prize in the Iced Cakes Section at the Mareeba Agricultural Show and not have entered on more than 2 previous occasions
