



UVR Charitable Health Care Program Overview

In collaboration with health care providers in Utah County, Utah Valley Refugees has created a system through which the uninsured refugees and immigrants obtain needed health care before it becomes an emergency. UVR can accomplish this by leveraging donated physician and hospital care, as well as by providing culturally appropriate case management and interpreter services.

Mission

The mission of our health education and promotion program is to improve access to and coordinate comprehensive healthcare for refugees and immigrants in need.

Purpose

The purpose of this program is to educate refugees and immigrants on basic health care principles, empower them to know how to navigate the healthcare system, lead them and their families to a happy and holistic lifestyle, and to establish a network of health providers willing to provide free care to uninsured and low-income refugees (minimum of 50 primary care physicians, 30 specialists, and 5 dentists).

Goals

- Provide health care case management services to low income and uninsured refugees who currently use the emergency room as their main source of primary care.
- Reduce the number of refugees' use of emergency rooms by 50%
- Create a large network of volunteer provider network (VPN)
- Educate refugees on how to navigate healthcare system in the United States

We aim to decrease the number of refugees and immigrants who are forced to use the ER as their only recourse and wish to improve access to medical care for low-income and uninsured refugees in Utah County.
