APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must be a high school senior in the Campbell Union High School District high schools and applying for or accepted to undergraduate studies at an accredited institution of higher learning. This scholarship recognizes students who have overcome challenges in life or academics, are committed to supporting their community and plan to pursue a degree in a Business-related major. We believe that diversity must be centered in the work we do. Hence, we strongly encourage applications from people with diverse identities or who are members of other marginalized communities.

ABOUT MIKE KOTOWSKI

Mike Kotowski's impact on the City of Campbell will be felt for generations to come. Mike was first elected to the City Council in 1983 where he served for 10 years. He has also served as the Mayor of Campbell three different times – in 1985, 1990 and again in 2011.

He is a past President of the Campbell Chamber of Commerce and was its "Citizen of the Year" in 1982. Mike was also a founding Board Member of the Campbell Historical Museum and the Campbell Veterans' Memorial Foundation.

Mike has a BA and MFA in Art and Design from San Jose State University and holds a Community College Credential and taught Art at West Valley and Mission Colleges. His works can be seen around the valley and have been featured in the Orchard Supply Calendar. He has several of his works in the California Railroad Museum in Sacramento.

The Process

After all applications have been received, the information will be reviewed by the Campbell Chamber Community Foundation Board of Directors and the finalist will be notified by February 23, 2024. The essay, combined with review of supporting documents, recommendations or academic record for those meeting eligibility requirements, will be the basis on which the scholarship is awarded.

Important Information

The criteria the board will use in the selection process is an evaluation of information provided in the application. We look at these awards as an investment in our recipients and the future of our community recognizing the commitment, persistence and character of applicants taking the next step in their education. The expectation of our award winner of this scholarship is that they will graduate with an undergraduate degree in Art, Science, Public Policy or a related field.



This scholarship seeks to recognize a student showing scholastic achievement and driven by community involvement. Share with the board a brief narrative on you, why you would be a good candidate for this award and how you fit the characteristics of this award. Use the essay to tell us about yourself, some possible areas you may cover include your work history, academic accomplishment, your academic and career goals and your motivations for them, and your ties to Campbell. Our interest is in you so please make sure you give us insight into you and your character.

The Campbell Chamber Community Foundation plans to honor scholarship recipients at its Celebrate Campbell event on Saturday evening, March 16, 2024.

Eligibility

This scholarship is open to current seniors in the Campbell Union High School District interested in pursuing a degree in a public policy, art, science, or a related field.

Applications without a personal statement will not be considered.
