YES, WE'RE OPEN (SAFELY)! The COVID-19 Pandemic has affected all of us in many ways and will continue to do so. According to the Greater Chicago Food Depository, 66% of food

pantries that partner with them are still open. We are pleased to say that we are one of them! Although we closed on March 26th, we knew our help was needed as much as ever. In fact, with people out of work, we expected many new people might be coming for help. And yet, we had to ensure the safety of our volunteers. After thinking for awhile, we came up with a new process that met both needs and so we reopened on April 7th. Now, those coming for help check in at our front window, receive a number, and drive to the back parking lot to receive pre-packed boxes (currently supplied for free from GCFD) placed directly in their car. In addition, we are still able to give out produce, dairy products, and even some meat. Less volunteers are needed for now and everyone can stay safe with wearing masks and gloves. Although we miss the personal contact with our clients, we are happy that we can still help them with food. If you look at our monthly numbers, even under these circumstances, we still found opportunities to pray with some of the families. As the quarantine extends into May, Operation Blessing will continue to do what we can to help those in need and let them know that even in this Pandemic, the Lord knows and cares about them








SPRING CHORES
