NOTICE is hereby given that the Kent County Council hereby makes the above named Order under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which would be to:-

The Kent County Council in the above named Order will implement a 'One Way Traffic' in the following roads or lengths of roads;

QUEENS AVENUE; from a point 15 metres northwest of its junction with Queens Road in a south-easterly direction to that junction.

A copy of the Order, an explanatory statement and a map indicating the location and the effect and a copy of any other Orders which will be amended by the proposed Order may be examined on Mondays to Friday at The Kent County Council, Sessions House, Maidstone, ME14 1XQ and at The Kent County Council, Highway, Transportation & Waste, Ashford Highway Depot, Henwood Industrial Estate, Unit 4 Javelin Way, Ashford, Kent TN24 8AD during normal office hours or viewed online at www.kent.gov.uk/highwaysconsultations

Anyone may, by application to the High Court within 6 weeks of the date of publication of this Notice, challenge the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in them on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or any instrument made thereunder, or that there has been a failure to comply with any statutory requirement in relation to the Orders.

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

The Kent County Council as traffic authority hereby makes the Order referred to above and as shown on the drawing accompanying this document for the following reasons :-

The Kent County Council are implementing a 'One Way' traffic system at its junction with Queens Road and Double Yellow Line restrictions (DYL's) in Queens Avenue near its junction with Queens Road – to improve safety, reduce congestion and reduce vehicle conflicts

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL, acting as the local traffic authority and in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as the "Act of 1984") as amended and Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:-

CITATION AND COMMENCEMENT

1. This Order may be cited as 'The Kent County Council (Queens Avenue, The Borough of Maidstone) (One Way Traffic) Order 2018' ('the Order') and shall come into operation on the 16th day of August 2018.
2. No person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police Officer in uniform cause or permit any vehicle (including pedal cycles) to proceed in those lengths of road specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order other than in the direction specified in the adjoining section of column 3 of that Schedule, except in the case of a vehicle in the course of an emergency for fire and rescue services, ambulance service or police purposes or a vehicle in the service of the local authority in the course of road cleansing or gully emptying.
